


Equipment: Footage will be shot in 4K resolution



- Determining the best course of action to get a film distributed depends on the budget, genre, and production value for the project.
- Because we are seeking funding such that we will not have to cut corners, we expect to attract B-C level talent and a primarily non-union crew which will provide quality performances and avoid excessive financial union obligations.




Stage Craft Productions, LLC

• A successful professional couple takes a much needed vacation and rents a house by the beach only to discover they aren't as alone in the house as they might think.

Sorry, Wrong Text (Short - Suspense/Drama)

• A woman who is reluctant to try online dating connects with, what she believes to be, an interesting potential companion. When she arrives to meet him for the first time, their encounter takes a dangerous turn.

Trial Separation (TV/Streaming - Comedy)

• During their 1 year conditional suspension from the bar, two affluent attorneys (who hate each other) can only practice law in a legal clinic in a rough neighborhood.

In the Aftermath (TV/Streaming/Webseries - Drama)

• Tells the stories of families from different walks of life who struggle to find normalcy in the aftermath of family trauma.
