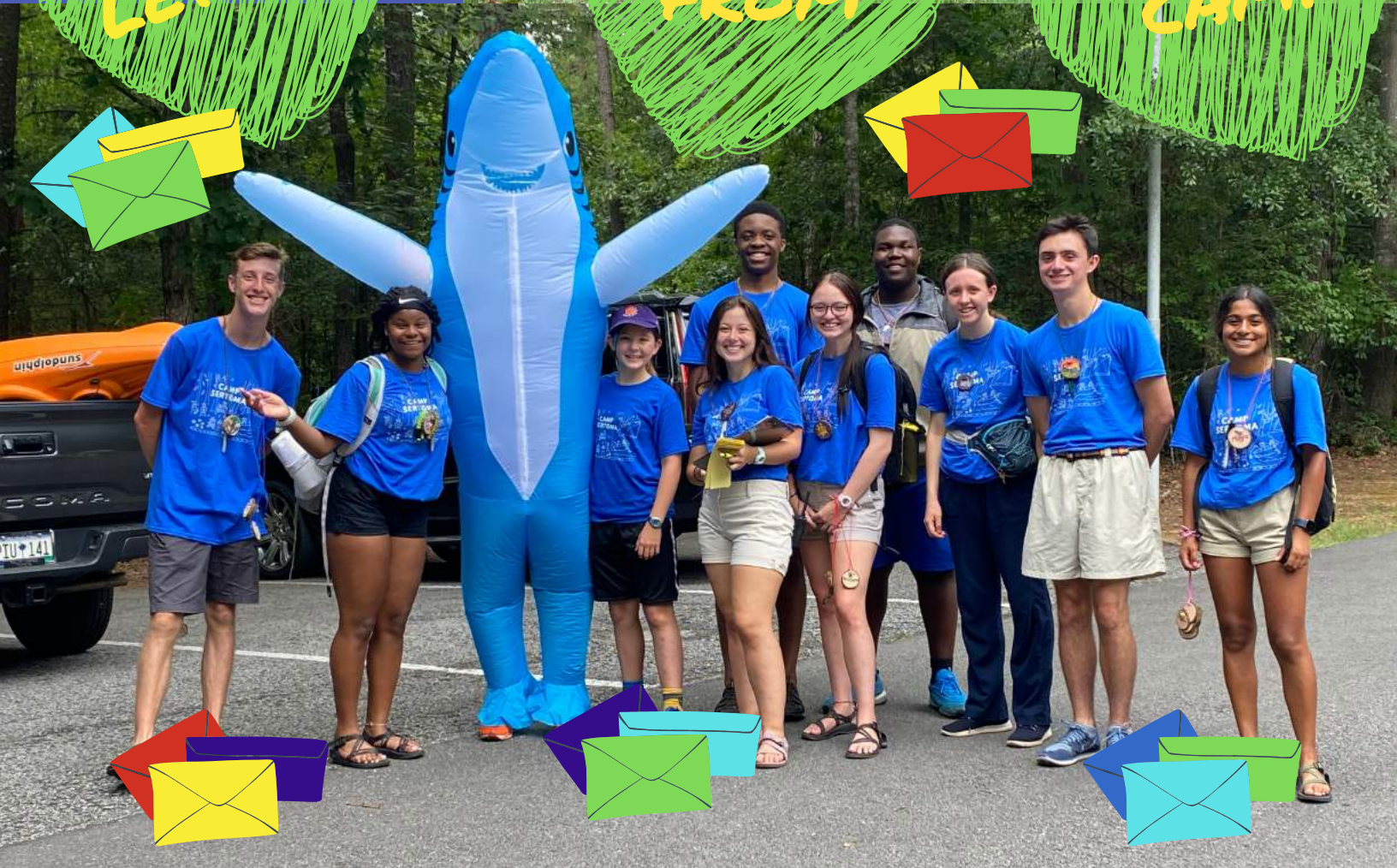

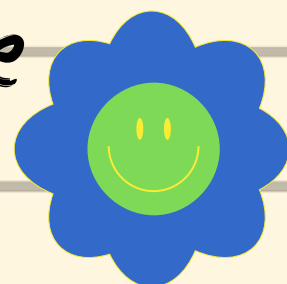
Dear Mr. Sertoman,
