THE MAPLES (The Gardner Mansion)

The Maples was completed in 1896 by Archie Gardner, a grandson of Philo Beckwith of Round Oak fame. The Round Oak Furnace Company sold their furnaces and pot belly stoves throughout the world. My son Jake saw one in New Zealand and I have seen them in the State of Washington. The mansion was made with Michigan field stone and features beautiful woodwork throughout. It has a grand hall and also an outlying observatory and carriage house.

THE ROOKERY (The Lee Mansion)

The Rookery was built in 1895 by Fred Lee of the famous Round Oak Stove Company. It is made of local uncut field stone and has tons of oak, maple, mahogany and butternut hardwoods throughout the home. It also has a carriage house and a cool carriage step. There is a grand ballroom on the third floor. My first dwelling in Dowagiac was in a beautiful second floor apartment which faces the street that you are on. Note the curved windows.
