Are Demons Scared of YOU?

So, a while ago, I was ministering to a lady who is quite sensitive in the spirit. We called up a demon that didn't have any legal rights and so he, the demon, knew what was coming next. I was a little bit tired of this one's shenanigans on this particular day and got up in his face (of course my client was very aware even though it was her physical space I was encroaching upon it wasn't against her but the demon).

In any case, afterwards she told me that she could feel the fear that this demon had when I got up in her grill (I'm trying to be hip and cool but I usually blow it when I do).

I find that, generally speaking, many people are scared of demons. Sometimes this is out of ignorance. Other times they feel that is not their calling. Also, they may not understand who they really are, the identity that they have from the Father and the authority that they have from Yeshua/Jesus being in them.

Even if you do know those aspects, there is still a learning curve as He trains our hands for battle (2Sam 22:35, Psa 18:34, Psa 144:1). The more you learn and experience in spiritual warfare, the more the fear of the unknown diminishes.

That's not to say we'll ever have it all figured out. But, when the pieces are in place, you become a little bit more emboldened to deal with demons once you start understanding that we are fighting spiritual beings more than flesh and blood (Eph 6:12), and start understanding they only have as much power as we give them - although we've given them a lot through the generations.

But still, truth be told, the demons should actually be more scared of us than we are of them. The demons know this, so they start attacking us even as little children trying desperately to keep us from ever figuring this out.

They use all different types of fear to keep us down - and here I mean fear in the broadest sense - rejection (fear of not being accepted), anger (sometimes this is the fear of not being in control), sickness (fear of not being healthy), etc. - to put fear into us. They try to get us to focus on those things instead of Yah's/God's Word and who we really are through Yeshua/Jesus.

I'm not saying it's easy, I'm just saying that's how they operate most times. But I want to take a look at what the Bible says about thisin particular in the book of Acts after The Ruach haKodesh/Holy Spirit was given to indwell within those who have accepted Yeshua/Jesus as their personal Savior.

Acts 5:1-5, 9-11

"But a man named Ananias, with his wife Sapphira, sold a piece of property, and with his wife's knowledge he kept back for himself some of the proceeds and brought only a part of it and laid it at the apostles' feet. But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back for yourself part of the proceeds of the land?

While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not at your disposal? Why is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to man but to God." When Ananias heard these words, he fell down and breathed his last. And great fear came upon all who heard of it... (v9) But Peter said to her, 'How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord? Behold, the feet of those who have buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out.' Immediately she fell down at his feet and breathed her last. When the voung men came in they found her dead, and they carried her out and buried her beside her husband. And great fear came upon the whole church and upon all who heard of these things."

So, in large, part the book of Acts is really how we as disciples should be operating as we learn to actually live the bible and take dominion over the earth (Gen 1:26). I believe-Yah/God said that because He knew there were demons that needed to be dealt with that were cast down to the earth. But much like how the Jews didn't cast all of the

pagans out of the promised land - because we ourselves have gotten comfortable with sin, the enemy has grown to be a formidable force.

That's another reason why people are scared of demons. Because the sin all across the land has empowered the demons because of the evil that has been allowed. The demons feed off this negative energy.

So, even if you aren't called to be a deliverance minister, by sharing what you can of the Yeshua/Jesus and His Word with a non-believer, doing good 'works,' however you are called to do that, you are helping to slowly grow the Kingdom of Yah/God. So it is in Heaven, so it be on Earth doesn't happen automatically.

Isaiah 59:15-16

"And the truth is lacking, and whoever turns away from evil makes himself a prey. And יהוה saw, and it displeased Him that there was no right-ruling. And He saw that there was no man, and was astonished that there was no intercessor. So His own arm saved for Him, and His righteousness upheld him."

2 Chronicles 16:9

"For the eyes of יהוה diligently search throughout all the earth, to show Himself to be strong on behalf of those whose heart is perfect to Him. You have acted foolishly in this, so from now on you shall have battles."

We all have a part to play. You've been created for a time such as this (Est 4:14). There are too many 'disciples' that are on the sidelines as the enemy is trying to take over this world. They are quite content with their contemporary complacent religion. As long as they have enough money in their bank

account, they are good with life.

We were created for so much more. I'll just end with this. We know we are in a good place when we are living out verses like this:

So really those that are doing evil should be seeing and even be fearful or in awe of the True Living Yah/God that we allow to be expressed through us. But when evil is allowed to thrive unchallenged... well, that's a much more tragic story.

I despised presentations and I would always want to skip out on them and do an alternative assignment or just present to the teacher privately. I would still get nervous presenting privately and had a hard time saying what I had to say. Once I was done, I would walk out embarrassed but relieved at the same time because it was over. By the grace of God, I got through it and moved forward in life. Unfortunately, as I got into my 20's, I remained a very lukewarm Christian and never took my walk with God seriously. Over time, my speech got worse and worse to the point where I would stutter on just about every word. It was like God was taking His hand completely off me and my life was a mess.

What stands out to you about this scripture? What does it say to you?

Let's read it again.

Romans 10:10

"For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." For it is with your heart that you believe.

To me this is so deep and so profound. Many times, we think that it is all in our mind. We battle and battle because the battle is fought in the mind. That may be true to a certain extent, but the heart is the territory we are fighting for.

As little children, we believe everything right? Why do you think Jesus said that we must come unto Him as little children?

Matthew 19:14

Matthew 18:3

"Then he said, 'I tell you the truth, unless you turn from your sins and become like little children, you will never get into the Kingdom of Heaven."

Here are two different scriptural references about thoughts being generated from the heart. The Holy Spirit reminded me of a teaching Perry Stone did related to the heart being able to think. He spoke on it in 2020 at Kings Cathedral on Maui when he was in town. It was a powerful message. The Holy Spirit that night showed me that He was healing my heart. God is so amazing because He is bringing it all full circle.

Not only do we see that God can and does know our heart, but He also knows our anxious thoughts!

The Lord brought me to Samuel in response to a question I had about His heart. God is so amazing. He began to reveal so much to me through the story of Hannah and Samuel.

The Birth of Samuel: 1 Samuel 1:1-5

"There was a certain man from Ramathaim, a Zuphite[a] from the hill country of Ephraim, whose name was Elkanah son of Jeroham, the son of Elihu, the son of Tohu, the son of Zuph, an Ephraimite. He had two wives; one was called Hannah and the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none. Year after year this man went up from his town to worship and sacrifice to the Lord Almighty at Shiloh, where Hophni and Phinehas, the two sons of Eli, were priests of the Lord. Whenever the day came

for Elkanah to sacrifice, he would give portions of the meat to his wife Peninnah and to all her sons and daughters. But to Hannah he gave a double portion because he loved her, and the Lord had closed her womb."

I want to stop here and note that the Lord had closed her womb. This may be hard for some to swallow. She could not have children because of the Lord. Let's keep going:

1 Samuel 1:6-8

"Because the Lord had closed Hannah's womb, her rival kept provoking her in order to irritate her. This went on year after year. Whenever Hannah went up to the house of the Lord, her rival provoked her till she wept and would not eat. Her husband Elkanah would say to her, 'Hannah, why are you weeping? Why don't you eat? Why are you downhearted? Don't I mean more to you than ten sons?"

Hannah at this point is hurt. Her heart is hurt. She has experienced trauma.

1 Samuel 1:9-13

"Once when they had finished eating and drinking in Shiloh, Hannah stood up. Now Eli the priest was sitting on his chair by the doorpost of the Lord's house. In her deep anguish Hannah prayed to the Lord, weeping bitterly. And she made a vow, saying, 'Lord Almighty, if you will only look on your servant's misery and remember me, and not forget your servant but give her a son, then I will give him to the Lord for all the days of his

life, and no razor will ever be used on his head.' As she kept on praying to the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. Hannah was praying in her heart, and her lips were moving but her voice was not heard."

Please note that Hannah was praying in her heart. It wasn't her mind, or her soul... she was praying from the deep place. She wasn't just thinking and praying, she was pouring. This gets God's attention. Psalms 34:15 even says that the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous and His ears are open to their cry. He hears you... He wants our hearts.

Okay going back to the scripture:

1 Samuel 1:13-18

(v13 continued) "Eli thought she was drunk and said to her, 'How long are you going to stay drunk? Put away your wine.'
'Not so, my lord,' Hannah replied, 'I am a woman who is deeply troubled. I have not been drinking wine or beer; I was pouring out my soul to the Lord. Do not take your servant for a wicked woman; I have been praying here out of my great anguish and grief.' Eli answered, 'Go in peace, and may the God

of Israel grant you what you have asked of him.' She said, 'May your servant find favor in your eyes.' Then she went her way and ate something, and her face was no longer downcast."

Hannah believed in her heart. She believed so much that it changed her actions. This is deep. Her actions changed because of her belief. She began to eat where before she would not.

1 Samuel 1:19-20

"Early the next morning they arose and worshiped before the Lord and then went back to their home at Ramah. Elkanah made love to his wife Hannah, and the Lord remembered her. So in the course of time Hannah became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel saying, 'Because I asked the Lord for him.'"

Here it is. We don't understand the trauma that we have been through. We don't understand all of the why's, but God has a plan.

The Lord is near to the brokenhearted.

Hannah reached out with her broken heart and God answered.

This story is so awesome because it doesn't end here. The Lord chooses Samuel to take over for Eli. It was prophesied that Samuel would do what is in God's heart and mind according to 1 Samuel 2:35:

"I will raise up for myself a faithful priest, who will do according to what is in my



heart and mind. I will firmly establish his priestly house, and they will minister before my anointed one always."

Not only this, but Samuel was the one to anoint David as king. David was noted as one who was after God's own heart according to 1 Samuel 13:14:

> "But now your kingdom will not endure; the Lord has sought out a man after his own heart and appointed him ruler of his people, because you have not kept the Lord's command."

And Acts 13:22:

"After removing Saul, he made David their king. God testified concerning him: 'I have found David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do."

God responded to Hannah's heart with His own Heart! He allowed Hannah, and the response to her heart's prayer, to bring forth the king of a nation and ultimately the King of Kings, our Lord and Savior (His Ultimate Heart)- because as we know Jesus is in direct lineage to David.

Don't be mistaken, it is all connected... He could have chosen anyone, but He chose people who had relinquished their hearts to Him.

He is wanting our hearts. He is wanting not only a pure heart, but he is wanting to heal our hearts just as He healed Hannah's heart.

We want to be in a different place, but we keep going around in circles... I submit to you this is because we are not doing the first thing that He commanded.

He said in Deuteronomy, and Jesus reiterated it when He walked the earth:

Deuteronomy 6:5

"And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

Matthew 22:37

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."

I truly believe that God was outlining a plan for our healing with this verse. I believe that the reason why we are not where we want to be with our walks is because we need to address the heart.

We focus on casting demons out of our souls and we try to retrain our brains; we wonder why our strength is fading, but if we do not address the heart we are missing the order of things. God led this command with the heart.

How can we believe if we have broken hearts? The good thing is God is near to the brokenhearted. This is His word and as we saw from Hannah, if we just open our hearts to Him, He will do a mighty work!

There is so much related to the heart that I could go on and on- like how the Lord's Prayer is a prayer of the heart.

The main thing for today though is this:

Face the hurt. Face the let downs. Face the things that broke your heart. The things that left you in a place where it is hard to believe from the heart.

"But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ."

I always thought that in the above verse, the writer (Paul) was talking about letting go of the things of the world (money, possessions, etc). But if you read the entire chapter, you'll see he's actually discussing letting go of his own ways of being made right with God (ie his flesh: his achievements and good deeds). See how verse 8 flows into verse 9?:

Philipians 3:8-9

"What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith."

As he declares himself (in the following verses), he had PLENTY of reason to boast about his commitment to the Law, and own self-righteousness. Based on written requirements, Paul was "that guy." He was undoubtedly honored in the sight of his fellow Pharisees and even a leader.

Philippians 3:4-6

"though I myself have reasons for such confidence. If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless."

But Paul knew that once he accepted Christ, all that had to go out of the window. Every status and accolade and thing he had built for himself, everything based on what he did, had to go. He knew his right standing with God would not stand on such things. That it was now faith-based (Phil 3:9).

Paul, in essence, says, "I let go of me and I found Him." He says, "ITS NOT ABOUT ME!" He says, "every external means I could have held onto as esteem, I let go of that I may have the Greater Thing: Christ!"

He compares the former recognition as garbage compared to knowing and accepting Christ. And there is much to know!

Anything that lifts the weight of perfection, doing, and being "good enough" off little me and puts it back on Christ (its rightful place) causes me to rejoice and breathe.

"Perfection" runs in the same circle as "Religion." They may even be cousins. They're both murderers. They kill relationship with the Holy Spirit, peace, and joy. They invite in pride, a critical spirit, and striving. Truth is, and will always remain:

Christ is the ONLY Way, the TRUTH, and the LIFE. No one comes to the Father EXCEPT through Him! We are now approved, boldly loved, and free to grow in grace in partnership with the Holy Spirit. Hallelujah!
