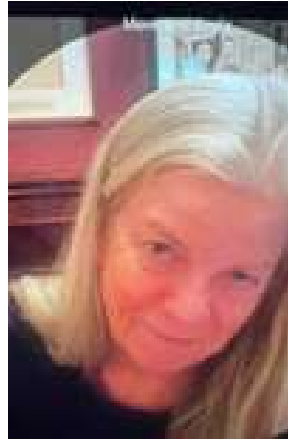
## From the Playwrights

The art and science of death and dying have plagued humanity for centuries. Sometimes we get so caught up with fearing it, we forget how to live joyfully moment to moment. Time is always an issue, isn't it? In this absurdist comedy, death looms over Mary and Roz, two aging actresses longing for the role of a lifetime. Having known each other forever as friends, colleagues, and rivals, but estranged for decades, they are suddenly and mysteriously reunited over the shared brainchild of creating art from their lives. Revisiting their separate and disparate memories and giving vent to individual fantasies, they weave a tale worthy of their upcoming appearance in *The Bardo*, which for them is the Great Hall of the Players Club on Gramercy Park. Here, the spirits of legendary actors Edwin Booth and Helen Hayes, emerge to encourage, inspire, and challenge Roz as she—often unskillfully—guides Mary through various phases of transitional consciousness into a new stage of existence. Ultimately, the lives of the two begin to imitate the art they struggle to create for this world and the next. And vice versa.

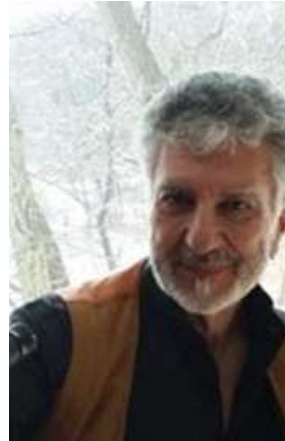

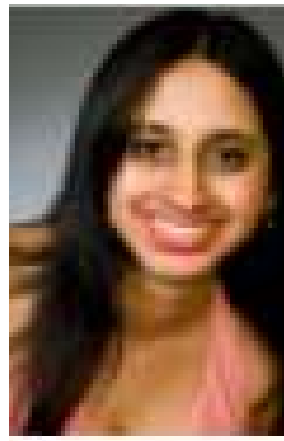

**Coni Koepfinger (playwright)**

Olwen Wymark Theatre Award recipient, Coni is the host of *Airplay/Determomed Women*, a weekly theatre program in its 12th season. In addition to teaching theatre, playwriting, English composition and literature at various universities like Carnegie Mellon, her alma mater, Coni is internationally published and a media advisor for the Lifeboat Foundation; a contributor for the Center of Conscious Creativity; a member of The Dramatists Guild; a board member of the International Centre for Women Playwrights; and committee chair for League of Professional Women in Theatre. Coni is a resident playwright at Manhattan Rep and produced all over by the Acting Company; the Secret Theatre; Unfringed Fest NYC; Pan Asian Rep; Me Too / Harlem; Untold Stories of Jewish Women; TNC's New Blood Series: PLAYBILL'S Virtual Theatre Festival in 2020; Manhattan Rep's STORIES film competition; The Rogue Theatre Festival 2022 and *My Dinner with Mary* published by Next Stage Press. What's Next? *Eve of Beltane*, with Joe Izen, directed by Victoria Rae Padgett; and *Kingdom Come*, a bold new musical with Joe Izen directed by Sia Koskina, premiering 2023 in Athens, Greece; and *Stories* with Cynthia Peters-Arnold, Matt Matthews, director; produced by Lois Saperstein's Arts-house. In development: *JAK, Beyond the Beanstalk*, a family musical with James Scheider; *Josie in the Bardo*, directed by Maria Olon Tsaroucha, Blue Sky Productions; and two more projects with Joe Izen: *Schoolhouse*, directed by Joe Mancuso; and *Magdala*, a musical work on the life of Mary Magdalene.

**Dan Carter (playwright, director)**

studied acting at San Francisco's American Conservatory Theatre, apprenticed with Houston's Alley Theatre, made his professional debut in Theatre Company of Boston's *Richard III* starring Al Pacino, and has appeared onstage throughout the country and in numerous films. He was Artistic Director of Pennsylvania Centre Stage, Producing Director of Illinois Shakespeare Festival, and Founding Artistic Director of Appalachian Theatre Ensemble. For 22 years, he was Director of the Penn State School of Theatre, prior to which he was Associate Dean at Florida State and Chair at Illinois State. He was Dean of the College of Fellows of the American Theatre and President of both the National Association of Schools of Theatre and the National Theatre Conference. With Brant Pope, he co-authored the book *Using Open Scenes to Act Successfully on Stage and Screen*. He is a recipient of the Society of American Fight Directors' Patrick Crean Award.

**Carla Susan Lewis (Roz)**

is an award-winning character actress who has worked in Shakespeare rep (*Richard II, Julius Caesar, Taming of the Shrew*), regional theatre, Film, and network TV. She is repped by Dream-Maker Talent Management and is a proud member of Actors Equity and SAG-AFTRA. Returning to the business after completing her PhD at the Graduate Center, Carla is thrilled to embody Roz Diamond in *Auditioning for Eternity*, a heavenly love letter to theatre and life.

**Mary Tierney (Mary)** AEA and SAG-AFTRA started her acting career in Dublin in the early '70s for five years. Coming back to NYC to start The Billy Munk Theater and Quaigh's Lunchtime Series. He is the featured writer and singer on the A.V.I. Album titled "Finalmente," by Renzo Fraiese, as well as the co-author and vocalist on the album "Breeze" released on the Barclay International label. He is also a published songwriter with Warner Brothers Publishing since 1986 and is currently affiliated with B.M. I. Music. In the world of Television and Radio, Joe can be heard as the solo vocalist on many popular National and International commercials, including "Coke," "Coors Light," "Chrysler," "Dole Fruit," "Folgers Coffee" "Come to Israel" "Long John Silvers" and "Budweiser." As a Dramatist, Joe has stepped in as director for several regional musicals, including *Annie*, *Grease*, *Sound of Music* and the more serious plays, *Antigone* and *Love Letters*. He is also the author, composer and lyricist of the musical *Verush*, the story of a young Woman sold into captivity on the silk road and her struggle to survive. In his latest endeavors, Joe has teamed up with a creative writing partner, the Internationally Published Playwright Coni Koepfinger from Carnegie Mellon, and together they have written three full length plays; *Schoolhouse Kingdom Come* and *Eve of Beltane*. They hope to bring a new and elevated consciousness to their work in theatrical entertainment and are already beginning to attract the attention of several well-known producers.
