


Genealogy Book

Spotlight - Hall of Fame Inductees

William Moultrie

William Moultrie's decades-long sports career left a lasting legacy as a coach and trailblazer. As Howard University's head track and field coach (1973–1993), he led the Bison to 10 MEAC championships, produced 71 NCAA All-Americans, and sent many athletes to the Olympic Trials. In 2023, he was inducted into the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Moultrie's impact extended beyond track and field. He served as Howard's assistant football coach (1973–1982) and Director of Athletics (1986–1990). In 1992, he became an Olympic assistant coach, and in 1996, he broke barriers as the first African American to serve as an Olympic track referee in Atlanta.

Before his time at Howard, Moultrie made history as the first African American football coach at Stanford University (1968–1971), contributing to two Rose Bowl victories. He later coached in the NFL with the Denver Broncos as a special teams coach.

Congratulations to William Moultrie on his incredible achievements and his well-deserved place in the Hall of Fame!

Eric Miller

The Rome-Floyd Sports Hall of Fame, established in 1971, honors athletes and community members who have significantly contributed to the development of sports in Rome, Ga. Nominations are open year-round, allowing the community to celebrate local legends.



This year, Eric Miller was proudly recognized as a Hall of of Fame inductee. A standout athlete at Coosa High School, Miller excelled in both football and basketball. As a running back, linebacker, and defensive back, he earned All-Area honors multiple times and was named Rome-News Tribune Football Player of the Year in 1987. Over two seasons, he led the area in rushing, amassing an impressive 2,524 yards and 17 touchdowns.

On the basketball court, Miller's talent shone just as brightly. Averaging 19.7 points per game in his senior year, he ended his high school career with 1,340 points, making him Coosa's second-leading scorer at the time.

Congratulations to Eric Miller on this well-deserved recognition for his incredible achievements and lasting impact on the development of sports in his community.
