



The weather is scorching. The view outside the window looks peaceful, but once you step outside, you can truly feel the searing heat of Arizona. When the days grow hot, irritability tends to follow. And if you happen to suffer from heat exhaustion, both your body and spirit can become deeply weary.

This morning, I found myself at church unusually early. A groundskeeper was already cleaning around the building next door. As I entered the church, I couldn't help but notice how noisy it was for such an early hour. Later, I stepped outside for an errand and saw a thick layer of dust covering my car. What's more, after he blew dust from the neighboring parking lot, I couldn't say for certain, but it looked like our church lot had become even dirtier by comparison. I felt quite upset. I found myself thinking—if only a bit more care had been taken, this unpleasantness could've been avoided.

There are fundamental behavioral guidelines we generally consider common sense, such as public order, morality, consideration, and ethics. A nation that upholds these basics well is often seen as a developed country, while places where these foundations have broken down are considered underdeveloped. Of course, this can vary depending on individuals, but it is greatly influenced by civic awareness, national character, and culture.

In several Southeast Asian countries, people often don't strictly follow traffic lanes. Although it may appear chaotic, they manage to drive without much difficulty. In some nations, it's even common to relieve oneself—urinate or defecate—on the street. On the other hand, in countries considered 'developed,' there are those who keep the inside of their cars clean but dispose of trash by throwing it out the window. However, if such behavior were to occur in the United States, it would draw strong criticism.

“Among the things we do—sometimes without even realizing—there are actions that may cause discomfort to others. It's worth taking time to reflect on whether we ourselves are unknowingly acting outside the bounds of basic order or common sense. From the way we greet others, to our tone of speech, our daily habits, and our attitudes toward work—shouldn't we, as Christians, strive to live with greater kindness, consideration, and a higher moral standard toward those around us?”
