

Doing Things “In the Gaps”

As the new year began, I found myself spending far less time away from my desk. Perhaps that's why my body often feels uncomfortable. From time to time, I get up to stretch and walk around the church building. My eyes feel tired as well. Yet when I look around, I notice many things. I see the weeds that constantly spring up around the church, and the trees that have grown thick and wild. I never water them, but somehow they grow so well. I had planned to take care of them during our big church cleaning day, but when the day actually came, I didn't get to it at all. So now I'm thinking of taking care of them little by little whenever I have a moment.

The expression *“jjam-jjam-i”* means “whenever there's a spare moment.” It's not about setting aside a long block of time to finish something, but about doing a little at a time whenever time allows. Eventually, there comes a moment when the task is completed. But when you look back, you sometimes realize you need to redo the part you started with. Because you haven't set a fixed time or a clear boundary for how much you'll do, you don't really know how far you'll get or when it will be finished. And that's what makes it enjoyable.

There are things we must do at set times. There are daily routines we follow—washing, eating, working—through which we pass each day. But between these scheduled moments, there are always small gaps of time. A wise person is someone who knows how to use those gaps well.

During discipleship training, we memorize Bible verses. Memorizing Scripture is often more effective when done “in the gaps” rather than at a fixed time. If you make a small memory card and review it briefly whenever you can, it seems to stick better. There is also what I call “in-the-gaps prayer.” You step outside for a moment, look up at the sky, and pray. Sometimes a single sentence can draw you deeply into communion with the Lord. You might exercise for a moment, clean something, or organize a small area. Surprisingly, there are many things you can do in these little pockets of time. And once you begin to enjoy doing things “in the gaps,” you start to feel a new kind of energy flowing into your life.


