A person who has always excelled in studies may not fully grasp the struggles of someone who doesn't. Those born into wealth cannot comprehend the feelings of those who aren't. A business owner might not fully understand the mindset of an employee, and vice versa, an employee might not fully grasp the perspective of the owner. We have aspects we can empathize with and aspects we cannot.

Why do Korean men talk so much about soccer? Why do they get so passionate about military service stories? Why do people lose track of time when discussing golf? It's because there's a lot they can empathize with. They have unforgettable memories, tough times, and touching moments. Sharing these experiences brings great joy. When someone listens to your story and you find someone whose stories you can relate to, you naturally become drawn to them.
