



“My House Shall Be a House of Prayer.”

Last week, I harvested about ten figs. Last summer I had picked one orange and enjoyed it, and although the fig season had long passed, I was still able to gather a few figs. They were sweet and delicious.

There is a passage in Scripture where Jesus, seeing a fig tree by the road, approached it but found no fruit, and He cursed the tree. Even though it was not the season for figs, Jesus rebuked the tree for having no fruit, and it withered from the roots. It was not simply because Jesus was hungry and found no fruit. Between the moment Jesus cursed the fig tree and the next day when the disciples saw it withered, the cleansing of the temple took place. Like the olive tree, the fig tree symbolizes Israel. Jesus’ curse on the fig tree can be understood as a prophetic act condemning the fruitless religious rituals of the temple system.

Jesus entered the temple and drove out the merchants. As a result, the chief priests and their associates—whose main source of income came from selling sacrificial animals and exchanging money—suffered great loss. From that moment on, they began plotting how they might kill Jesus.

Why was Jesus so angry? Jews coming to the temple believed that as long as they offered a sacrifice—whether blemished or not—they would receive God’s blessing. The spiritual leaders exploited this belief for their own gain. They tied every aspect of temple ministry to their own profit. The temple had become a den of robbers.

Jesus drove them out and declared, “My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations.” This is the reason the fruitless fig tree was cursed.

Our church must be a house of prayer. It must be a place where we experience the presence of God. Through our church, God’s Word must be proclaimed, and through our church, lost souls must return to the arms of the Lord. Through our church, wounded hearts must find comfort, and those who have lost their way must discover the path they should walk. There is no other way but prayer.
