Skin - previously noted wound improved with only mild skin thickening remaining

General Appearance: Bright, alert and responsive, CRT < 2 sec, mucous membranes pink, BCS: 4.5 /9

Hydration: Hydration appears normal

Eyes: Corneas clear, no opacities noted, pupils normal in size and symmetrical, sclera white, no ocular discharge OU

Ears: No exudate observed, no redness present, tympanic membranes observed, intact and normal AU

Oral Cavity: Mild tartar

Nasal Cavity: No obvious abnormalities observed, nares clear with no discharge present

Cardiovascular: Regular rhythm; no murmur detected

Respiratory: Lungs auscultate clear bilaterally; trachea clear

Abdomen: Abdomen palpates normally; no pain, tenderness or masses on palpation

Rectal: Did not perform rectal exam

Musculoskeletal: Normal ambulation, no lameness observed, Ambulatory x 4, full gait examination not performed, no long bone pain, no obvious joint pain or effusion

Integument: Raised firm nodule dermal mass with 2 pinpoint areas of serosanguinous discharge/oozing, L caudal lateral abdomen

Lymph Nodes: Lymph node palpate normal in size

Urogenital: External genitalia appears normal; bladder palpates normally

Neurologic: No apparent abnormalities, full neurologic examination not performed

Client Communication: Discussed exam findings, recommend clip/clean of affected area for better visualization and due to reported discharge. Recommend treatment with steroid/abx over 10-14 days, monitor response and recheck to monitor progress. If nodule still present recommend aspirate at this visit to assess possible underlying.
