## **November Meeting Summary:** The Annual Business Meeting

11-25-2024 at the Apple Blossom Restaurant in Clinton.

The meeting was held at the Apple Blossom Restaurant in Clinton. We had an informative presentation by Chase Lindsey and Liz Ibbotson about the election stats in Anderson County. They were able to report on the results, as well as how the results compared to other counties, previous years, and other candidates in the same November election. One result that showed promise for the future was that Anderson County went 3.2% more for Trump than Harris; however, the state went 7% more for Trump. Also, the data showed there was some ticket splitting with a number of voters voting for both Trump and Gloria Johnson. Anne Backus' results showed that she had more voters in Districts 4 and 6 than did Harris. The results were also interesting for the School Board positions. Ashley Craven was elected; however, Tiffany Malone was a very close contender. Overall, in districts 6, 7, and 8 Crank got 26.86%; Craven got 24.92%; and Malone got 22.46%. The other 2 candidates, Gleason and Jeter, got 13.11% and 12.65% respectively.

Ann Mostoller gave a synopsis of the programs the club hosted in 2024, with 8 informational programs, 1 picnic, and 1 holiday party. Amanda Mantooth provided year end financial numbers for the club. Ann Miller shared her goals for the club in 2025, including increasing membership, increasing the newsletter mailing list, having more club members serving on boards & commissions, sponsoring members to attend EMERGE training, and closing out our PAC status with the state.

The voting members present elected all the ACDWC officers proposed by the Nominating Committee. The voting was conducted by Regina Guy in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order. There were no nominations from the floor.

The proposed and duly elected officers were: Ann Miller – President; Ann Mostoller – Vice President; Sissy Byram – Secretary; Amanda Mantooth – Treasurer; Tiffany Malone – Nominating Chair.

We thank Pat Marshall for her service as Secretary, and Regina Guy for her service as Nominating Chair in 2024.
