


Recycling in the City of Oak Ridge

Yes!

The stuff in your Oak Ridge recycle bin is really recycled

85 to 90% (by weight) of the stuff in your recycling bin is actually sold to industry to be turned into new products

10-15% of what is collected ends up going to the landfill



What happens to your stuff?



- Cardboard
- Paper

Plastic

Sorted and bundled for shipping

To industrial users

- Aluminum
- Ferrous metal (cans)
- Unusable to landfill

Single stream (what you put in your recycling bin)	722 tons
Old corrugated containers (boxes)	17 tons
Mixed office paper	11.5 tons
Steel food cans	24.7 tons

Aluminum cans	24.7 tons
Lead acid Batteries	15 tons
Used automotive oil	250 gallons
Residential municipal wood waste	396 tons

What can be recycled

- boxes especially corrugated ones, slightly dirty (like a pizza box) is OK and staples are OK
- Paper any kind, staples and envelopes with windows
- Aluminum (but not foil) most valuable, if you recycle only 1 thing- recycle aluminum cans
- Plastic Only type 1 or 2. NO plastics bags or ropes!!!!!!!!! leave on caps if the bottle has it
- Paper containers paper coffee cups, juice boxes, milk cartons – just a quick rinse. These are new!!
- Cans but not if they contain paint or toxics food cans, Olive oil cans

What to avoid

 Please, please don't put recyclables in garbage bags. The bags gum up the system. Stuff in bags is likely to end up in a landfill!!!! Very sad

If in doubt about a plastic item, toss the item in the garbage. There is almost no market for any plastics that are labeled 3, 4, 5 or 6. They just pollute as they breakdown into micro plastics. Try to avoid using.

- Glass the system can't handle it and it is dangerous for the workers at the recycling plant
- Dirty items pose a health risk to workers

- All things Tech chargers, printers, hard drives, labelmakers, mobile phones, shredders, scanners etc, etc
- Printer cartridges
- Batteries rechargable and single use
- School supplies –
- Luggage and tech cases, watch bands
- Monitors up to 49" (\$19.99 each)

Things that can be recycled but not in your Bin or at the City recycling facility

Plastic Bags

 Plastic bags- <u>Krogers, Walmart, Food City</u> all collect plastic bags. You can include with your clean plastic bags almost all flexible clean plastic (e.g., bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, plastic bags that held items you bought via mail).

 Cut out paper labels that are on plastic bags before recycling.



Proposed TN Waste to Jobs Act

- Objective is to create TN jobs thru recycling packaging waste and reducing taxpayer burden
- Approach is to require producers of packaging to pay for the TN infrastructure needed to capture and recycle packaging
 - Provides companies with resources (paper, glass, plastic, metals) that are now going to landfills
 - Shifts the cost of recycling from taxpayers to the companies producing packaging.
 - Has bi-partisan support
 - Has considerable industry support (big international companies)
- Still in development. Proposers hope to bring to the legislature next year.






Proposed system for TN
