I'd also like to mention that if you're a fan of WWII aviation, the Commemorative Air Force B29 / B24 Squadron



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


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
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## Financial tips for widows and widowers

You can't claim your deceased spouse's benefits along with your own retirement benefits, so if you qualify for survivor and retirement benefits, you'll receive the larger amount. Depending on your situation, you might come out ahead by delaying your retirement benefits, giving them the chance to grow, while you accept survivor benefits. For more details on receiving Social Security benefits, visit the Social Security Administration's website at www. ssa.gov.

• Review your estate plans. The death of a spouse can certainly affect your family's estate plans. So, it's a good idea to review these plans to see what changes, if any, need to be made. When conducting this review, you'll benefit from working with an estate-planning professional.

Finally, keep in mind that you don't have to go it alone during this difficult time. If you're already working with a financial professional, they can help. If you aren't currently working with one, now might be the time to start. 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

### Living Gluten Free Deliciously

**Microwave Stuffed Peppers** Quick, Healthy and Easy (or oven, see bottom)

These stuffed peppers cooked in the microwave are a quick. simple, and good meal that you can cook for yourself and have leftovers or dinner for 2. . You can use any color of pepper. Try using garbanzos instead of kidney beans for a variation of this recipe.

2 large red bell peppers, halved and seeded

- 1/2 (15 ounce) can kidney beans, drained and rinsed •
- 1/2 cup frozen corn kernels, thawed and drained
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese

#### Instructions:

1. Arrange pepper halves in a 9-inch square glass baking dish. Cover the baking dish with plastic wrap and poke a few holes for vents. Cook in the microwave until tender, about 4 minutes. Set aside.



2. Mix together tomatoes with liquid, rice, and hot water in a medium microwave-safe bowl.

Cover the bowl with plastic wrap. Cook in the microwave until rice is tender, about 4 minutes.

3. Remove plastic wrap carefully. Stir in kidney beans, corn, green onions, and red pepper flakes. Re-cover the bowl with plastic wrap. Cook in the microwave until heated through, about 3 minutes.

4. Spoon hot tomato mixture evenly into pepper halves. Cover the baking dish with plastic wrap and poke holes for vents. Cook in the microwave for 4 minutes.

5. Remove plastic wrap. Sprinkle stuffed peppers with mozzarella and Parmesan cheese. Allow to stand until cheese is melted, 1 to 2 minutes.



I baked it in an oven safe dish after I cooked the peppers in the microwave . Stuffed them, used an Oven safe dish, foil cover, baked at 350 for 40 minutes.

### Inaredients

- 2 zucchini, sliced into ¼-inch thick rounds
- 1/4 cup pizza sauce, or more to taste
- 20 slices pepperoni, or more to taste
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese, or as needed

**Zucchini Pizza Bites** 

Italian seasoning, dried parsley, or oregano for sprinkling (Optional)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Spread zucchini slices in 1 layer on the prepared baking sheet.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until zucchini is tender, about 15 minutes.
- 4. Spoon pizza sauce over each zucchini slice and top with pepperoni and mozzarella cheese. Sprinkle herbs over each.



5. Bake in the preheated oven until cheese is melted, about 5 minutes more.

Be creative! You can use cooked mushrooms,, sausage, anything you like, just make sure your ingredients are cooked and drained before topping.



### **Easy Homemade Strawberry Lemonade**

### Inaredients

- 1 heaping cup sliced ripe strawberries, hulled and halved
- 3 cups filtered water
- 1/2 3/4 cup agave

### Instructions:

Add all ingredients (starting with the lesser amount of agave) to a high-speed blender and blend on medium-high until

smooth — about 30 seconds. Adjust flavor as needed. Will keep up to 5 days, sealed in the refrigerator

## Can a Trust own an LLC?



The limited liability company (LLC) is a popular business structure that offers liability protection and avoidance of double taxation. Trusts are popular asset transfer vehicles that can be structured different ways to avoid probate and keep assets out of the hands of creditors. By placing LLC

membership interests in a trust, business owners can combine the two types of legal entities and enjoy the best of both worlds.

## The following are some of the key benefits of placing LLC interests in a trust:

• Probate avoidance. Probate is the Court process of settling an estate after somebody passes away. Probate could cause your business to languish. Assets in a trust avoid probate and the Court process.

• Efficiency and Privacy. Probate court records are public. Because trusts bypass probate, the assets they contain pass to your beneficiaries more quickly, efficiently, and privately.

• Incapacity planning. What happens to your business in the event of accident or illness? If your LLC interests are held in a trust, the trust can be structured so that your incapacity immediately triggers the authorization of another person to take over on your behalf.

• Asset protection. Depending on the type of trust in which you place your LLC membership interests, the trust can make it more difficult for creditors to go after the trust assets.

The type of trust you chose will have pros and cons for holding LLC assets.

• Revocable trusts are trusts that can be controlled, changed or canceled during the lifetime of the person who establishes the trust. Upon your incapacity or death, a new trustee and a new beneficiary (or beneficiaries) are named.

• Irrevocable trusts (including asset protection trusts) have the advantage that most creditors cannot go after the assets owned by the trust. The level of access and control retained will determine the level of creditor protection and tax consequences. It may be possible for the business owner to maintain management and income from an LLC that is placed in a trust. These types of trusts are highly specialized and quite complicated from a legal and accounting standpoint. Ultimately, the trust will specify who will receive your LLC membership interest.

Placing your LLC interests in a trust means that the trust—not you individually—is legally an LLC member and a party to the LLC's operating agreement. Although the law permits a trust to own an LLC, the LLC operating agreement may not. Therefore, you will first need to check whether the operating agreement and business partners are accepting of this arrangement.

Transferring an LLC to a trust requires a bit of paperwork, but a well-planned transfer can help reduce risks, keep your business affairs out of government hands, and fit into your broader estate planning goals.
