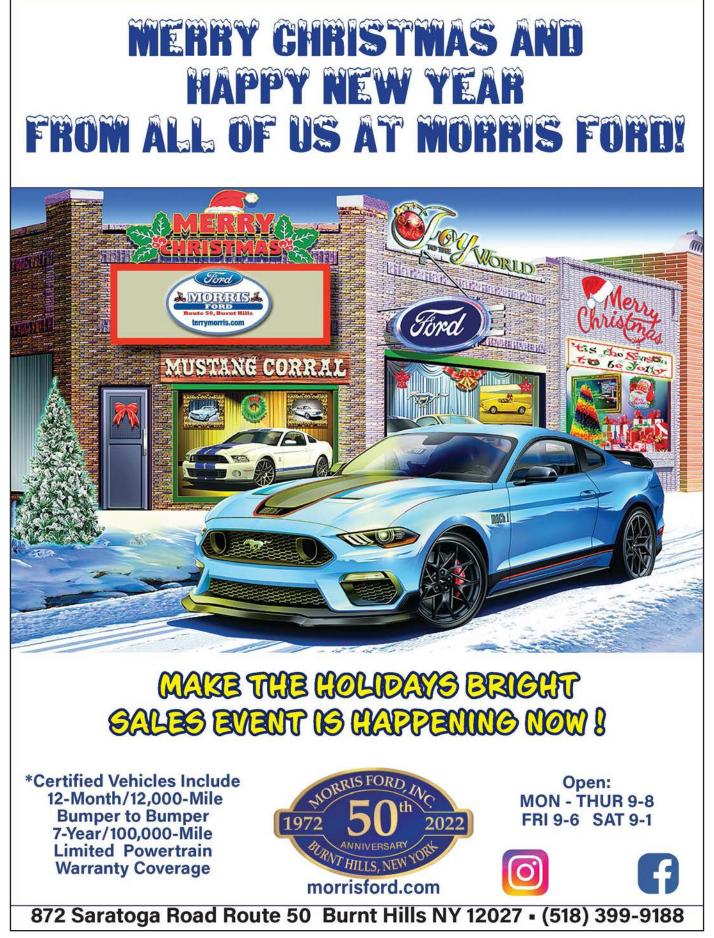

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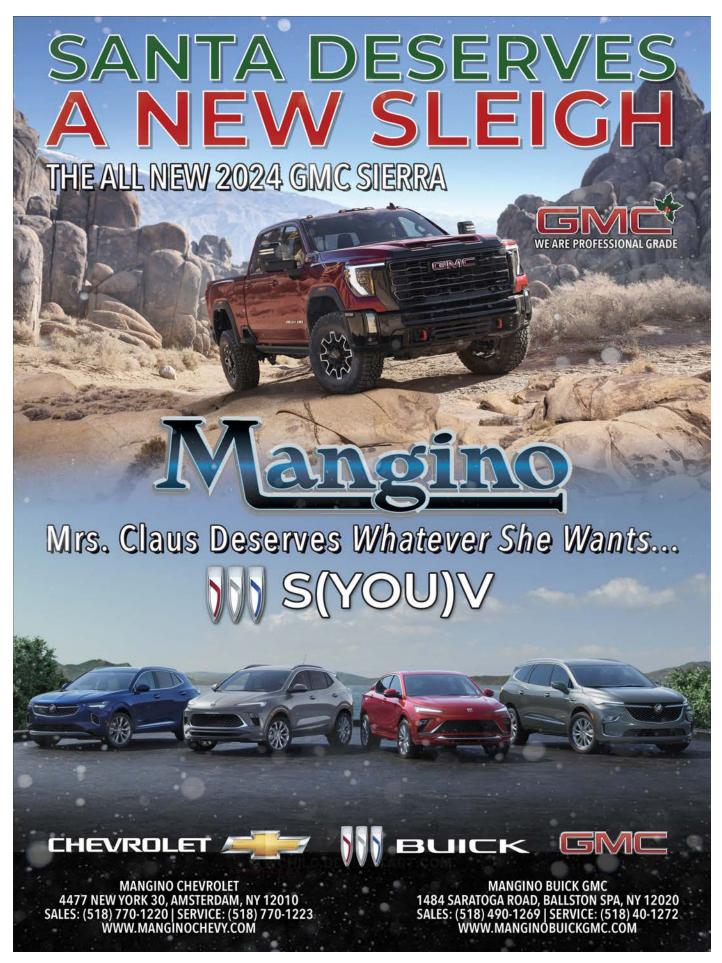
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## New Year's Financial Resolutions



Now that we've reached 2024, you might be thinking about your goals and hopes for the new year. But in addition to whatever personal resolutions you might make — volunteering, going to the gym more, learning a new language and others — why not make

some financial resolutions, too?

Here are a few to consider:

• **Boost your retirement savings.** If you can afford it, try to increase your contributions to your IRA and 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan. The more you put away in these accounts, the greater your chances of reaching your retirement goals. At a minimum, contribute enough to your 401(k) to earn your employer's match, if one is offered. And whenever your salary goes up, consider raising the amount you put in to your 401(k).

• **Reduce your debts.** It's not always easy to reduce your debts — but it's worth the effort. The lower your debt load, the greater your monthly cash flow. So, look for ways to consolidate debts or find other, possibly more productive, ways of using credit. And if you truly can't afford something that's nonessential, don't go into debt for it. "Live within your means" is an old piece of advice, but it's just as valid now as ever.

• Build an emergency fund. If you suddenly needed a major home or car repair, or received a large medical bill not fully covered by insurance, would you have the funds available? If not, you might be forced to dip into your retirement accounts or other long-term investments. To avoid this possibility, try to build an emergency fund containing several months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account that's separate from the ones you use to meet your daily expenses. It can take a while to build such a fund, but if you make it a priority and contribute regular amounts each month, you can make good progress.



• Avoid emotional decisions. Too many people overreact to events in the financial markets because they let their emotions get the better of them. If the market is temporarily down, it doesn't mean you need to sell investments to "cut your losses" — especially if these investments still have good fundamentals and are still appropriate for your portfolio. It can be hard to ignore market volatility, but you'll be better off if you focus on the long term and continue following an investment strategy that's designed to meet your needs.

• Review your goals. Over time, your goals may have changed. For example, while you once might have wanted to retire early, and planned for it, you may now find that you'd like to work a few more years. If that's the case, you may also need to adjust your financial and investment strategies.

• Revisit your estate plans. If you've married, divorced, remarried or added children to your family within the past few years, you may need to review the account titling and beneficiary designations on your 401(k) and other retirement assets, along with your estate-planning documents, such as your will or living trust. You might also need to revise these documents in other ways.

Of course, you may not be able to tackle all these resolutions at one time, but if you can work at them throughout the year, you can potentially brighten your financial outlook in 2024 — and beyond.

# **Estate Planning with a Disabled Beneficiary**



If you have a child with special needs or disabilities, before making a gift during life or by inheritance, you should be concerned whether their government benefits and programs may be disrupted. The applicable Government programs have stringent eligibility requirements – some

health-related and some financial.

#### What government benefits are available for Special Needs Individuals in New York?

#### Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

was created to ensure that the elderly, blind, and disabled have a guaranteed minimum monthly income for living expenses. Eligibility is strictly based on financial need – total assets valued less than \$2,000, with limited exemptions. People who qualify for SSI may also qualify for Medicaid that covers many health care costs

#### Social Security Disability Income (SSDI)

pays benefits to those who paid into Social Security through payroll taxes, but are now unable to work according to the very strict Social Security definition of disability. After two years of receiving SSDI benefits, the beneficiary automatically becomes eligible to receive Medicare, even if they are under age 65.



#### Differences Between New York Special Needs Trusts and New York Supplemental Trusts

In many states, the terms "special needs trust" and "supplemental needs trust" are used interchangeably.

More precisely, a "special needs trust" is set up to hold assets already owned by the disabled person, sometimes as the result of a personal injury or medical malpractice settlement or judgment. Any money that remains in the fund after the beneficiary's death must be used to reimburse Medicaid. A variation on this includes a "Pooled Trust" which must be administered by a non-profit organization with the assets/income of the disabled person held in a separate account for their benefit. Most commonly, the remaining account balance on the death of the person will stay with the administering charity to benefit other disabled individuals. If not, Medicaid must be reimbursed.

A "supplemental needs trust" is set up for a person with disabilities by a third party, such as a parent of a child with a disability. The trust usually covers things like education, clothing, recreation, uncovered medical care, etc. Because the assets were never owned directly by the person, the beneficiary of a supplemental needs trust can still receive benefits from government programs. In most cases, no payback is required after the beneficiary's death.

More important than the terminology is to make sure that the trust meets the requirements of the government program benefits currently receiving or anticipated. If the trust doesn't comply with these requirements, the person with special needs (the trust beneficiary) would likely lose their government benefits.

*These are highly technical areas with strict regulations.* Don't rely on the internet or your friends for answers! ## Tongue Tie: Can a Chiropractor Help?

## Sweet Potato Hash with Eggs

#### Ingredients

- 2 teaspoons canola or corn oil
- 1/2 medium onion, chopped
- 4 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/2 medium red or green bell pepper, chopped
- 2/3 cup fat-free, low-sodium vegetable broth
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme, crumbled
- 1/2 teaspoon coarsely ground pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 4 large eggs
- hot pepper sauce (optional)



## **Superfood Pecan Energy Bars**

#### Ingredients

- 15 dates (9 ounces)
- 1 cup pecan pieces
- 1/2 cup gluten-free oats
- 1 tablespoon chia seeds
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt



#### **Directions:**

In pressure cooker set on saute, heat oil. Cook onion 3 minutes, or until soft, stirring frequently. Turn off pressure cooker.

Stir in potatoes, bell pepper, broth, garlic, paprika, cumin, thyme, pepper and salt. Secure lid. Cook on high pressure 3 minutes. Quickly release pressure. Turn off pressure cooker.

Remove pressure cooker lid. Crack one egg into small bowl. Using back of spoon, make small well in potatoes. Slip egg into well. Repeat with remaining eggs, making separate well for each egg. Secure lid with pressure vent open. Saute 2 minutes. Let stand on "keep warm" setting 2 minutes, or until eggs are cooked to desired consistency.

Serve hash sprinkled with dash of hot pepper sauce, if desired.



## Preheat oven to 200 F.

In food processor, process or pulse dates until chopped and rough texture forms. Add pecan pieces, oats, chia seeds, vanilla extract, cinnamon and kosher salt; process about 1 minute until crumbly dough forms.

Line baking sheet or jelly roll pan with parchment paper. Dump dough into center of parchment paper and use rolling pin to roll into 6-by-10 1/2-inch rectangle. Cut dough into 14 bars about 1 1/2-by-3 inches or into desired shapes.

Bake bars 30 minutes. Cool bars to room temperature then refrigerate in sealed container between sheets of wax paper.

To package for on-the-go snacking, cut 4-by-6-inch rectangles of wax paper, wrap around bars and secure with tape.

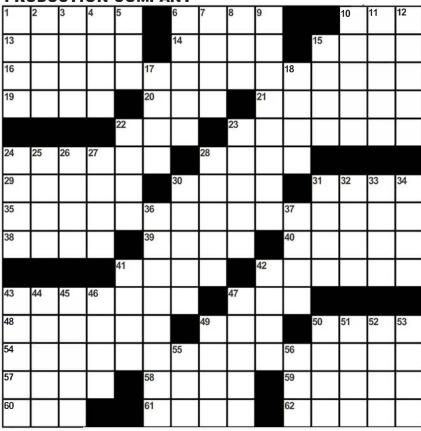

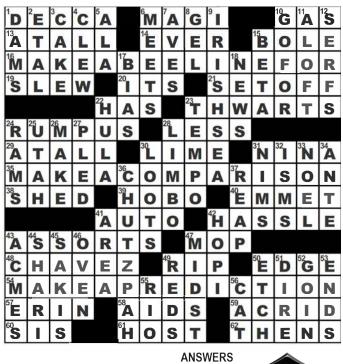
