Dear Parishioners,

Communication methods have changed significantly over the years. Traditional telephone landlines have been replaced by cell phones and email. The parish staff often encounters disconnected phone numbers. Updated contact information for all parishioners is necessary.

There is a registration form included in this bulletin. Extra forms will also be available on the registers in church. I am asking all adults and families in the parish to fill out a form as thoroughly as possible. Please return completed forms in the Sunday collection basket or in the designated box on the back porch of the rectory. You can also mail them to the parish office if you wish.

Another prominent issue is that we do not have current information regarding the number of households in our parish. If your adult children have moved out and still consider themselves members, then they should be listed as their own household in our records. Please ask them to complete and return a separate registration form.

Having accurate records will allow us to better minister to the needs of our parishioners. Please know that all information you provide will be secure and only used in context with the workings of this parish and in reporting to the Diocese of Toledo.

Greetings parishioners,

This past spring the school applied for the Governor's Emergency Education Relief II Support for Nonpublic Schools Grant (GEERS II SNS). We were generously awarded \$77,391.99. The GEERS II fund is designed to serve nonpublic schools in response to COVID-19. A group including Father Jeff, Business Manager Joann Palm, Principal Sue Sanders, and Maintenance Committee Chair Steve Marek, along with Maintenance Committee members met to discuss the best use of the funds allocated to St. Joseph School. The services and assistance that is allowable through GEERS II is very specific and must address needs that fall under the following guidelines INCLUDING:

- Supplies to sanitize, disinfect, and clean school facilities
- Other materials, supplies or equipment recommended by the CDC for reopening and operation of school facilities to effectively maintain health and safety
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after school programs
- Purchasing educational technology (including hardware, software, connectivity, assistive technology, and adaptive equipment) for students that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low-income families and children with disabilities

The Ohio Department of Education has contracted with Educational Service Centers (ESC's) to review all requests and administer the grant funds. To date, NCOESC has approved the following projects:

- Fiberoptic cables between our two building to enhance internet connectivity (\$19,594.03)
- Two water Coolers with Bottle Filling Stations (\$8,080.04)
- Summer tutoring (\$1,168.78)

We are waiting on approval from NCOESC for the following requests:

- Social Emotional Learning Educator's Kit \$199.99
- 30 iPads for education \$9,870.00

- Six laptop/iPad charging stations \$1,479.72
- Cleaning supplies and room purifiers \$9,564.94
- MIMIO Pro 654 Display for Music/Library Classroom \$2,648.96

If all of the above requests are approved, we still have a little over \$24,000.00 that must be spent by September 30, 2024. Our next thought is to replace the worn carpet in classrooms and common areas with vinyl flooring.

Unfortunately, there is a catch – the grant will pay for installation costs but will not pay for the actual flooring. According to the grant, "permanent upgrades" to a building such as flooring and windows are not allowable expenses, but installation costs are.

Cross Carpet gave us an estimate for product and installation. The installation cost that the grant will cover is \$18,335.53, leaving just over \$20,000 that we would have to pay out of pocket. That is a large amount that we would have to take from school support and our general fund, which at this time is not feasible.

Our St. Joseph Parish has been so generous to the school through the years, it is difficult to ask for assistance yet again. However, if you believe that new flooring is a worthwhile project for the longevity of the school, any financial assistance would be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your consideration.

If we raise \$15,000 in the next month I think we could cover the rest through school support.

Join Ms. Sanders and me in church next Sunday, August 4 after the 10:30am Mass if you would be interested in helping raise \$15,000 for this project.


