Greetings parishioners,

Has your family recently returned to the faith after being gone for the last few years? Did you neglect baptizing your child before they reached the age of reason? If so, don't despair!! This school year I will be offering Christian Initiation for children 7 years and older.

Perhaps your family would benefit from this program in which I will lead a 5-class teaching of the Catholic faith focusing on the Nicene Creed. After completing these 5 sessions the child may be baptized in the Roman Catholic faith.

WHAT IS THE NICENE CREED? It is the Creed / summary of beliefs of the Roman Catholic Church; it is the defining statement of belief of Christianity.

THIS PROGRAM IS SIMILAR TO BUT MORE CONDENSED COMPARED TO THAT OF THE ADULT OCIA PROGRAM. THIS OCI IS ADAPTED WITH AGE-APPROPRIATE MATERIAL, WHICH OFFERS TEENS THE TIME TO BE FORMED IN THE TEACHINGS AND PRACTICES OF CATHOLICISM. PREPARATION FOR FULL COMMUNION INTO THE CATHOLIC CHURCH THROUGH THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM TAKES PLACE DURING THE CELEBRATION OF THE EASTER LITURGY.






Do you have a friend, co-worker or spouse who is not Catholic but attends Mass with you regularly and might be interested in learning more

The Catholic Church and Politics in Ohio

Have you heard of the Catholic Conference of Ohio (CCO)? The CCO is the second-oldest state bishops' conference in the United States and serves as the official voice of the Catholic Church in Ohio on matters of public policy and government relations.



As stated in *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, "While the bishops help form the laity in accordance with basic principles, they do not tell the laity to vote for particular candidates." The CCO is non-partisan and does not endorse any candidates.

On behalf of the Catholic bishops of Ohio, the CCO advocates for laws and legislation in Ohio that align with a Catholic vision of a moral and just society by:

- Collaborating with Catholic dioceses across Ohio to champion Church teachings that advance the common good.
- Forming consciences of Ohio legislators on matters of public policy.
- Testifying in support of or opposition to proposed legislation in the Ohio House of Representatives or Senate committees.
- Equipping Catholics to get involved and support public policies that uphold their beliefs and values through a monthly newsletter, action alerts, and advocacy events.

Faithful Citizenship: Dignity of the Human Person

In Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the U.S. identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching—Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity—and apply them to concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote but to provide a foundation for Catholics to better evaluate policies, platforms, and candidates in light of the Gospel and the Church's moral and social teaching. This entry focuses on the Dignity of the Human Person.



Because each human person is created in the image and likeness of God, each one of us possesses innate and inviolable human dignity. This dignity is present in each person from the moment of their conception and throughout their lives. As Pope Francis has emphasized, human dignity is central to building a society where we are "brothers and sisters all" (*Fratelli Tutti*, no. 8).

We engage in the public square with a foundation of human dignity that:

- Protects the most vulnerable—children in the womb who are in danger of abortion—while also standing in radical solidarity with mothers.¹
- Upholds the dignity of the elderly, disabled, or ill by strongly rejecting euthanasia and assisted suicide.
- Recognizes migrants and refugees through immigration reform that respects human dignity, provides a path to citizenship, and addresses the root causes of migration.
- Supports the dignity of the person, created male or female, and opposes an ideology that denies the difference and reciprocity between man and woman.²
- Overcomes racism in our hearts as well as in our systems and institutions, which denies that we are all equally made in the image of God.³
- Continues seeking reform of the criminal justice system, ends the use of the death penalty, and supports measures to reduce the threat of gun violence.⁴

Through our political participation, accompaniment of those in need, and the witness of our daily lives, may we support the dignity of every person created in God's image.
