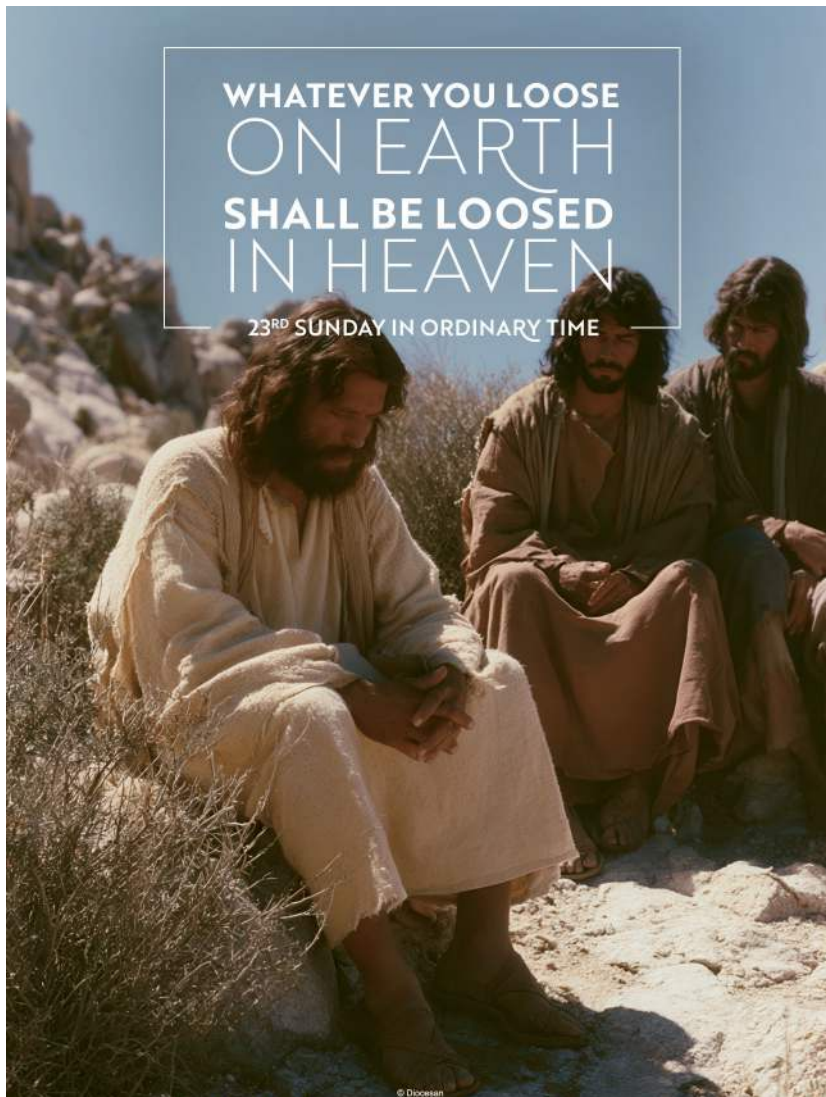

Greetings St. Joseph and Sacred Heart Parishioners,

Next week I will be out of town attending a leadership seminar. With this in mind, please remember that there will be NO DAILY MASSES or Confessions this week.

This leadership seminar is definitely a week that I look forward to, as it gives me an opportunity to continue growing in confidence and developing my leadership skills. This coming June, I will complete my first term as pastor of our parishes! Please pray that I get to stick around for another six years—or more! As is the nature of priestly assignments, this time next year I really don't know where I will be living or serving in the Diocese of Toledo. I certainly hope the Lord has many more years planned for me here!

Speaking of the Diocese, I thought this would be a good opportunity to give everyone an update on where we currently stand with the proposed school addition at Sacred Heart.

First, thank you again for the tremendous response to our soft-pledge campaign, which resulted in nearly \$2 million in potential pledges toward the proposed addition. Your generosity and support allowed us to take the next important step in the process: presenting the project to the Bishop and his team for review.

The Bishop is supportive of the proposed addition and is encouraged by the possibility of our Catholic school continuing to grow and thrive. At the same time, as Bishop, he has a responsibility to make certain that a project of this size is attainable and financially responsible for our parish before giving final approval to move forward.

Before making that decision, he has asked us to complete two additional steps.

First, he has asked for an updated maintenance plan for our existing school facilities. Before adding to what we have, we want to make certain that we are properly caring for our current buildings. We are utilizing the facility assessments completed by our architectural firm, Garmann Miller, to help guide this process. Thanks to the tremendous support and generosity of our parishioners over the past four years, we have already been able to complete many important updates and needed repairs to our school and parish facilities.

Second, the Bishop has asked us to hire an independent firm to conduct a parish-wide study examining both our fundraising capacity and projected future school enrollment. This will give the Bishop, our parish leadership, and all of us additional information to help determine whether the project is financially sustainable for the future. At this time, the cost of the independent study has not yet been determined. Once we have that information, I will be sure to share it with you.

Thank you again for your prayers, generosity, patience, and continued support as we discern the best path forward.

GOTHIC-INSPIRED CHURCHES

BETHLEHEM – Sacred Heart Church embraced Gothic architecture when it was constructed in the 1890s.

“We have pointed arches above the windows, buttresses on the outside walls, vaulted ribbed ceilings,” said parishioner Steve Metzger.

Many churches are laid out on an east-west axis, Steve added. Unlike Crestline St. Joseph or Shelby St. Mary, Sacred Heart is laid out north and south. He has a theory.

“As you're walking up the aisle heading east towards sunrise – the dawn of life – perhaps that's a symbol of new birth,” Steve noted. “I would have loved to have seen how they built this church with block and tackle, pulleys and ropes and horses. It's constructed out of sandstone out of a quarry that was in operation in Leesville, Ohio. When they mined that stone, they put it on rail cars and railed it down to Vernon Junction, three or four miles from here; then the farmers with their wagons and horses transported the stone up here.”

Reminiscent of years past, the church's bell - Catherine - named in honor of the donor's wife, Jacob Rundy, rings again.

“I went around and talked to some of the elderly parishioners, Deacon Steve Keller and Alice Metzger, to see what they remembered about the bell when they were young,” noted parishioner Luke Rietschlin.

The church was electrified in the 1960s under the pastorship of Fr. Riedlinger, so the janitor no longer needed to pull the bells' rope.

“It's not the kind of thing that works forever without someone doing some maintenance on it,” Luke shared. “When they did the church restoration, they did a lot of work structurally to make sure the bell didn't fall out of the tower because some things up there needed to be reinforced; I know my dad (Robert Rietschlin) was involved in that.”

Although it used to ring for the Angelus prayer everyday at 6am, noon and 6pm, “When I got the bell working again,” said Luke, “Fr. Jeff was here. He didn't want it to wake anybody up at 6am.”

It currently rings at noon and 6pm, in addition to before Mass.

On September 20 and September 23, Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire Catholic Ministries will release a documentary film in theaters nationwide, Heaven in Stone and Glass. The film is about “some of the most famous Gothic cathedrals in France,” said parishioner Sean Beeson, who scored the film's music.

“Bishop Barron talks about the history, architecture and some of the religious and spiritual significance behind the symbolism in the cathedrals,” Sean said.

After recently taking a trip to the top of Sacred Heart Church, Beeson was impressed to “see all the beam work – absolutely massive wooden beams,” he added. “It is incredible to think that something people built over 100 years ago still exists today because they believed in something greater than themselves. Similar to how people spent their entire lives building the cathedrals – it was to glorify God through beauty and majesty.”
