Tasting Notes: Aromatic and intense, this wine combines the most intriguing characteristics of the Malbec and Pinot Noir grapes. Cultivated with clean air, crystal-clear water, and stony soil, Arado's grapes are from the prestigious high-altitude Uco Valley in Mendoza. Pale pink, clean and bright. In the nose, it dazzles with intense fruitiness and red berries. In the mouth, silky texture with nice acidity and well-balanced alcohol. Nice finish with pink grapefruit and red berries notes.

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About Malbec:

Malbec is a grape variety originally from France. It turned out to be Merlot's half-sister since they share a progenitor, the Prunelard. It arrived in Argentina around the mid-19th century and was planted in nearly all Argentinean winery regions. On the foothills of the Andes Mountain Range from Jujuy to Rio Negro. This great natural geographical feature separates our wine country from the Pacific Ocean on the western side. On the eastern side, the wine country is separated from the Atlantic Ocean by about 700 miles of land. What results is an area that has the perfect climate for cultivation: Continental Climate with poor soil and low annual average rainfall that is ideal for the cultivation of quality bunches of grapes.
