Commander's Call



Fellow Legionnaire,

This month we will be honoring twenty Post 3 members for multiple years of Continuous Service in the American Legion. We will present certificates to nine 50 Continuous Year members, eight 60-year and three 70-

year members. All these members have been invited to attend our monthly meeting on April 14th at the Elks Club. Hopefully we will be able to recognize these folks in person and present them with their certificates. Six of these members live out of state and have already had their certificates along with letters from the Post congratulating and thanking them. Of course, any local members that cannot make it in person will have their certificates mailed to them.

In next month's newsletter we will recognize all twenty of these gentlemen with accompanying photos of those attending our monthly meeting. In times of declining membership these Legionnaires in particular command our highest respect and admiration for maintaining a lengthy continuous membership in the American Legion.

Additionally in April we will be recognizing University of Nebraska Lincoln (UNL) Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) and Northeast High School Junior ROTC students for Scholastic and Military Excellence with medals and certificates. These awards will be presented on April 16th at the 2026 Chancellor's Review in Cook Pavilion on the UNL campus and at Lincoln Northeast High School at their Junior ROTC Award Ceremony. Post 3 annually supports these important programs that prepare our young people to be good citizens and appreciate military service.

As noted in last month's newsletter Post 3 has one male and one female applicant for the 2026 American Legion Law Cadet Program. On April 2nd Post 3 will hold a board to interview and certify these two candidates as the District 15 nominees for attendance this summer at the State Patrol Training Academy in Grand Island.

At the Academy they will explore and experience various aspects of law enforcement such as firearms training and emergency vehicle operation. Additional areas of instruction are on drones, aviation support, gangs and SWAT. The Post will pay \$100 for each applicant which covers insurance, food, T-shirt, cap, classroom materials and administrative expenses. The Nebraska State Patrol provides training, counselors, facilities and equipment as a public service. Our candidates appear very well qualified to represent Post 3 and District 15 well.

Again, this month I want to advertise our Post 3 Scholarship program. We are offering three \$500 scholarships to students who are related to Post 3 members for continuing education. Applications are available in this newsletter, on the Post 3 web site at www.lincolnpost3.org and available on request at our office. Applications must be submitted to the Post not later than May 31st so if you have students who may qualify, please submit applications on time. Post 3 will convene a board to select the most outstanding candidates for these scholarships.

Finally, there is still time left if you have not renewed your Post 3 2026-2027 membership, please do that expeditiously. As you will see from this newsletter, we are doing very good so far in getting over 93% of our membership renewed. That last 7% is a challenge for us to achieve. As always please at every opportunity encourage any veteran you know that is not a Legion member to join us.

I am now into my second month as Adjutant of Post 3. I want to thank everyone for their support as I transition into filling Ed Schnabel's many years of service.

As of March 31st, membership is just above 93%. We have 877 members paid for 2026. Our goal from National was 923 members. We are now in the slow period for renewals. If you haven't paid your dues

there are several ways to continue your membership. You can pay online, send your dues to the post or stop by the office on Tuesdays or Thursdays from 10:00 to 12:00.

At our next post meeting, we will recognize members for 50, 60, and 70 years of continuous service. We have invited these members to our next post meeting on Tuesday, April 14th when we can present the certificates in person. Those unable to attend will be mailed their certificates. These are some great achievements.

We are also working on our Consolidated Post Report for the year. This document shows what Post 3 has done for the year so far. Examples of what we do are items such as Honor Guard, Oratorical Contest, Junior Law Cadet, Boys State and the like. This document goes to National, who in turn, lets our Congress and Senate know what we do to continue to fund Veteran's programs and also gives us a voice.

Lincoln CBOC/VA News



I want to wish a very Happy Easter and Passover to all Veterans who have given so much to protect this Country.

The VA is currently requesting Veterans to update their VA Identification Cards. If you receive a notice from the Department of Veteran Affairs, you can update your VA ID card while in the Clinic. You will need to bring some form of a State issued ID, like a Driver's License, etc.

The Lincoln CBOC can always use bus passes or gas cards. Gift cards can be used to buy clothing, coats, etc., as the needs come up during the year.

There will be a "Veteran Health Fair," at the Lincoln CBOC, Thursday May 28th. More details to come later.

Flu shots and Covid shots are now being given for those with appointments, walk-ins, or through urgent care. If you have an appointment, you will be asked if you wish a flu or covid shot, or to update any other vaccines that show up as overdue on your VA Health records. If you do not have an upcoming appointment, call your local clinic to schedule one. Covid shots are being given by appointment only.

If you receive a statement from the VA for Co-payments, remember that most CBOC do not have finance offices. If you have a billing question, you need to call the number that is listed on your statement. Mail payment to the address shown on your statement. You should find a finance office at most of the VA Hospitals, but they may have limited hours. This is true for the Omaha VA hospital.

Currently there are no mask requirements at VA clinics and hospitals. Masks are available for those who wish to wear them at the front doors of the clinics.

Express Care is a walk-in service, for those who wish to have a nurse check out minor items. Times might be different at your local clinic, so give them a call and see if they offer this service. This care is available to those who might wish to see a VA nurse without an appointment during normal hours. The Lincoln Clinic treats 300 a month as walk-ins.

With the signing of the PAC act, more veterans have become eligible for services, not only for those who served "boots on the ground", but anyone who has served since the Gulf War. If you have any questions, call your local county, or state service officer, or registered VSO. It only takes a few minutes to see if you might qualify for a new increase, or a new VA disability rating.

Veteran Affairs web sites are great places to visit. You can find out the latest information affecting Veterans. You can track claim status, file for travel pay, view your VA account, payments received, or Co-pay owed. You can make the Co-pay payments online, etc.

My HealtheVet site allows you to set up an account where you can view you VA medical records, track your meds, order meds, or contact your VA medicals providers. It is a quick and easy way to see notes on your latest appointment and track your upcoming appointments.

The Lincoln Clinic does not currently have an Advocate on site. If you need to talk to an Advocate, you will need to contact their office by phone. There are numbers to call, based on your question, posted on the door of the Advocate Office in the Lincoln Clinic

The Lincoln CBOC is trying to fill open staff positions, podiatrist, including a NP or nurse to provide foot care for Veterans in the Lincoln area.

There are many ways to serve veterans. The VA system has need of volunteers. The local clinics or hospitals can always use volunteers for Greeters or Escorts.

The VA can use more volunteers at your local clinic or hospital. You can volunteer to help veterans in a local clinic or hospital, or a veteran home. They can always use a monetary donation, or you can donate activities bags for younger kids to have when they come to the clinic or hospital with a parent for their appointments.

Hours given by the volunteers are credited with saving the VA Health at Omaha, Lincoln, and GI an equivalent of 25 full-time staff employees. This is based on an hour of service being credited at the rate of \$31.50 dollars per hour.

A food drive to collect food items for our homeless veterans in our area is still ongoing. Items requested are shelf ready, power bars, easy to open items (pull tabs), etc. Please do not bring in food items that are past their expiration date as they just must be thrown away. A can opener would be nice.

There are few requests for food items that need to be cooked, such as canned vegetables, baked beans, etc. Other items that our Homeless Veterans could use are hygiene care items. They should be the small size that would fit easily into a backpack. Volunteer Services has a list of the most requested items. In Lincoln, they can be reached by calling 402-486-7938 or texting Ty.Andrews@va.Gov.

Only trained service animals should be brought into a VA Health clinic or hospital. Trained service animals that qualify under DAV requirements are always welcome. Other pets do not qualify and should be left at home. If you do bring a comfort or emotional support dog into a VA clinic, you are responsible for cleaning up after them. Please do so. Don't leave a mess for others to clean-up.

Thanks for your service to your fellow Veterans and thanks for your service to this great country.

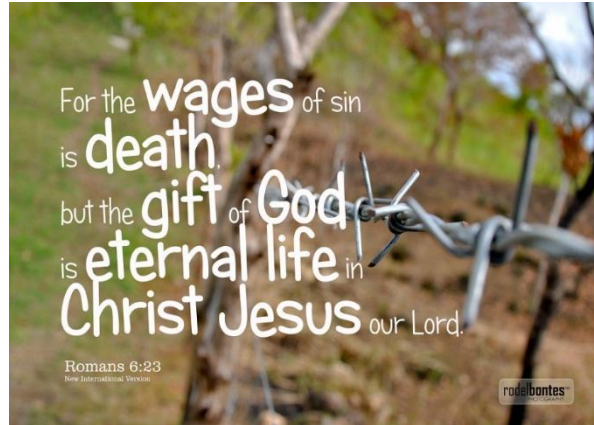

Adjutant Steve Fowles reported Post 3 membership at 872.

Gerry Wolf reported on Memorial Squad activities for January and February.

Squadron 3 Commander Brendan Moore announced that the SAL would meet this Thursday at the Post 3 business office.

Commander Ron Hindmand announced that we would be sponsoring one boy and one girl for the Jr. Law Cadet Program. Interviews of the applicants will be upcoming.

As carry-over business from the District Convention, tentative dates for the 2027 Law Cadet interviews and Boys State orientation were confirmed.

The Unit 3 Auxiliary was thanked for providing refreshments tonight in recognition of the American Legion Birthday.

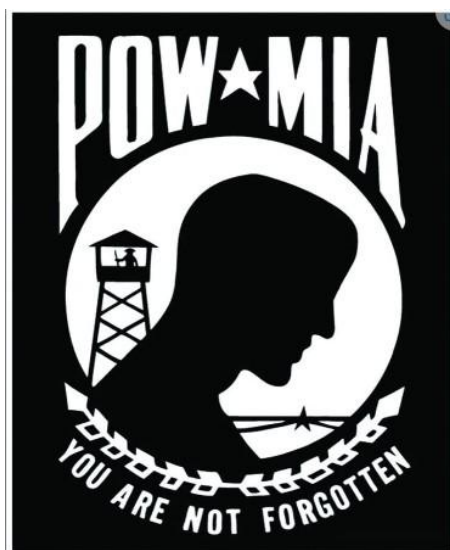

U S Army Air Force Serviceman identified from WWII



On Feb. 24, 2026, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency identified the remains of U.S. Army Air Forces Tech. Sgt. Jim W. Verhines, missing from World War II. Verhines entered the service from Texas and served with the 458th Bombardment Squadron, 330th Bombardment Group.

On April 13, 1945, he was the engineer on a B-29 Superfortress aircraft that took part in a combat mission against targets in Tokyo, Japan. During the mission, the aircraft was shot down. Verhines survived the crash but was captured and later imprisoned at the Tokyo Military Prison. He died on the night of May 25–26, 1945, when an air raid ignited a fire that burned much of Tokyo, including the Military Prison.

Following the war, the American Graves Registration Service recovered 65 sets of remains from the prison but was unable to identify any as Verhines. Thirty-nine Unknowns associated with the Tokyo Military Prison were interred at Fort McKinley Cemetery, now the Manila American Cemetery and Memorial, in Manila, the Philippines.

In 2022, DPAA exhumed those 39 Unknowns for laboratory analysis. There, scientists used modern forensic techniques to identify Verhines.

He is memorialized on the Courts of the Missing at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific.

Medal of Honor Recipient Terry Richardson



Staff Sergeant Terry P. Richardson distinguished himself by acts of gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty on September 14, 1968, while serving as the Lima Platoon Leader with Company A, 1st Battalion, 28th Infantry Regiment, 1st Infantry Division in the vicinity of Loc Ninh, Republic of Vietnam.

On this date, his company was tasked with the mission of securing Hill 222 in hostile enemy territory near the Cambodian border. It was a hilly area covered with rubber trees. Lima Platoon was assigned by the company commander to be on point for the mission. Staff Sergeant Richardson directed one of his squads to be the point element leading the way. Shortly after the assault began, three of the squad members became severely wounded and pinned down between three enemy machine gun bunkers. Going back on three separate occasions, Staff Sergeant Richardson advanced forward under heavy enemy fire and recovered his wounded Soldiers between heavy machine gun fire.

By the time he was able to make it back to join his unit, his entire company had been completely surrounded by the enemy. Staff Sergeant Richardson gave instructions to his soldiers to cover him and then, without regard for his own safety, advanced to the top of Hill 222 under enemy fire for better sight lines to direct the tactical air strikes. He began to direct the tactical air strikes and shortly thereafter became wounded by an enemy sniper. Staff Sergeant Richardson continued directing the tactical strikes for seven more hours, before the enemy broke contact with him and his company. Six soldiers from his platoon found him, still alive but wounded and unable to hear due to his proximity to the ordnance dropped all around him.

Staff Sergeant Richardson declined medical evacuation for his gunshot wound and requested that he be allowed to stay to lead his soldiers. The damage caused to the enemy by his direction of the tactical air strikes allowed his company to secure Hill 222 unopposed saving the lives of 82 fellow soldiers who remained in Alpha Company.

Staff Sergeant Richardson's conspicuous gallantry, extraordinary heroism, and intrepidity at the risk of his life, above and beyond the call of duty, are in keeping with the highest traditions of military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.

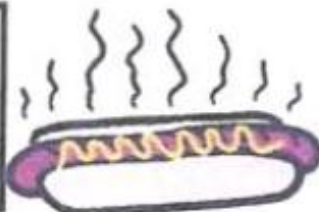
