#### LETTER FROM THE COMMANDER

Fellow Legionnaires:

This is my last article as your Post 3 Commander. The two years you have entrusted me with helping to manage your post have gone by quickly. Now, it is time to step aside and support our new officers. I urge all of you to provide them with the support and assistance that they will need to continue to move our post forward.



I truly appreciate all that you have done, and I know you will continue to support our Post 3 in its efforts to keep our American Legion strong. Without you, we have no American Legion.

Thanks for your hard work on membership. While the 2022-2023 membership year officially extends through the end of 2023, we have essentially reached the end of the functional membership year (07/01/22 - 06/30/23) at just over 90% of our goal of 2017 members --- and that's not good. Dues notices for 2024 from the national headquarters in Indianapolis will be arriving about July 1.

We need to do better. Every year, Post 3 membership is reduced by 8-10%. We need to replace the almost 80 members who renewed for 2022 and then died during the past year before renewing for this year --- as well as the almost 70 members who had renewed this current year but have since passed away.

In addition, we need to replace the members who, for whatever reason, just decided not to renew. That number was about 100 as this article was being written in mid-May. We still have our work cut out for us. If you haven't renewed your membership for 2023, please do so now. I trust you will answer the call.

We all have time, treasures, and talents we can give to this organization. If you are looking for something new to do, come to a meeting and join us. I want to thank each one of you for being a member of Post 3. Just the fact that you send in your dues money allows us to support the many causes of the Legion at the local, state, and national levels.

I have often said that the American Legion is only as strong as its membership. We must continue to lead the way to ensure that our veterans, our military service members, and our community are assisted in whatever way we can. I try to think of ways to get new members --- and especially the returning veterans --- involved in our American Legion.

July starts a new year for not only membership but hopefully for a few new ideas from you, the members. I would suggest that if we want to see The American Legion grow, we need to find a way to interest our target members and perhaps make some changes ourselves in this ever-changing world. We can't just ask for those young men and women to become new members. We must show them what they are missing.

Not long ago, I put together a list. This list was to be a list of activities that Post 3 has worked to support like charitable events, college scholarships, city projects, Memorial Squad, and other veterans causes. That list was quite lengthy; and, when I took time to read and really absorb it, it made me feel proud to see what

we had accomplished.

I'm sure that many non-members would also enjoy our American Legion Family. But, will they really understand all we do for the people who may fall on the aforementioned list? I could go on and on and on, but I think you get the idea. Our Legion, American Legion Post 3, must keep on keeping on. However, we need to see not only the familiar faces of Legionnaires who have made our post great in previous years --- but also some new members for our future. So, please step up when called upon because our Legion needs you!

As always, keep our veterans in your thoughts and prayers --- particularly those who may be in need. Keep our active-duty service men and women in your thoughts and prayers as well.




While we did not meet in May, we will begin and continue

#### The Relevance of POWs and You

As we live our day-to-day lives, it's easy to forget the incredible and heroic stories of our country's finest soldiers who endured the unthinkable as POWs in our nation's conflicts. It's also easy to forget --- and downplay --- our own military service and the impact that it had on our lives, the

lives we served alongside, and the success of our country.

As we move into the oppressive heat of summer and on to the wonderfully patriotic celebration of our Independence Day, let us be reminded of the sacrifices that both we and our beloved POW/MIAs endured, no matter how large or small, over the course of our military careers.

These experiences are incredibly relevant, and they contributed to the shaping of our lives today. Take a moment to pause and reflect on your own experiences within the service. Recall those you served alongside. The miserable places, as well as the incredible and awe-inspiring locations that your military service took you. Call to mind the good and bad experiences you encountered while serving alongside your fellow service members. Truly stop and recall the distant memories that you haven't thought about in a long time --- and relive those memories for a few minutes. Don't rush. Just dwell in that moment and recall every last trivial detail.

With these thoughts and experiences freshly in your mind, tell someone about them. The good, the bad, and what they meant to you and how those experiences shaped your life. Reach out to someone you served with or possibly a friend or family member who may have no inclination as to what truly constituted your military experience. Tell them the gritty details of the highs and lows of your time served. This not only allows them to understand you better, but it can be a freeing and therapeutic experience for you as well. The bottom line is that all those experiences have a tremendous amount of meaning and relevance attached to them, and that is an important aspect to remember as someone who has served our country.

In addition to sharing your own experiences, consider sharing the stories of some of our prisoners of war as well. As we all know, freedom has not come free. No one can attest to this better than the men and women who have served in the armed forces of our great nation we call the United States of America. Nobody knows better what it is like to have that freedom suddenly taken away than those individuals who, in the process of serving their country, have found themselves prisoners of war. It is an experience neither asked for nor desired.

Americans have been held captive as prisoners of war during many wars and in many places. Still, there is a common bond that is shared by all. Their story is an inspiring chapter of our history as a nation. It is our responsibility to ensure that our prisoners of war are never forgotten, and their stories are passed down to the generations. In that same token of thought, our own experiences and stories hold similar relevance and should be passed along as well. Tell someone your story.

#### NOTES FROM THE ADJUTANT'S OFFICE

#### RENEWALS.

Current membership stands at 1090.

A BIG "THANK YOU" is extended to those who have renewed for 2023. On the other side, however, I'm sorry to say we did not hit the 90% target date in March, and that was the first time we missed a target for 2023. We weren't close to the 95% target in April or the 100% target in May --- but are hovering around 90% and need to keep renewing as many members as we can.

The sixth and final mailing of dues renewal notices for 2022-2023 has been sent out by the American Legion National Headquarters. If you happen to be one of the few whose dues were received after the April cutoff date, you might receive a dues notice. If you know that you have paid your 2023 dues, just throw the notice away.

If you have not paid your 2023 dues, please pay them now. Post 3 memberships currently stand at about 90% of our assigned goal for 2023 --- 1217 members. We are down to about 130 members needed to achieve that target; but, due the loss of about 50-60 members to Post Everlasting, we have just 100 members or so active members who haven't renewed yet.

Achieving the 100% of goal will require renewal of ALL of our current unpaid members AND the acquisition of about 30 more. If only one in five of our current paid members could bring in a new member, a renewal of an unpaid member, or a paid transfer member, we would be a 100% Post for 2023. It's time to hit the streets and find those veterans who have earned the right to be a Legionnaire.

For those who have not paid your 2023 dues but will be doing so, please take the time to review the reverse side of the notice. These notices have been changed; and they have added the basic information that the American Legion has on file for your branch of service, war era, phone number, and email address. If some of your information is incorrect, please correct it and mail the form with your 2023 dues payment to 123 South 84th Street, Suite L, Lincoln, NE, 68510. I will see that it gets corrected in the database. Thanks for your help.

#### Does your 2023 membership show your correct years of service?

If the 2023 membership card that was mailed out to you shows an incorrect number of years, please let us know. We can get it corrected for you. We have fielded many calls about total years of membership not being correct. It takes a lot of work to double-check what is printed on the 2023 cards, so if your is not correct, please email or text me, and I can correct the years for you.

You can double-check your card from 2022 to see if the 2023 card has added one year for you. If not, let me know and I will mail out a new card with the correct years and have National update your membership record. { edschnabelasa@gmail.com; 402-480-8542 }

#### Vietnam Veterans Memorial Day.

I want to say thanks to all our Vietnam veterans for their service. For those who might have forgotten, Wednesday March 29, 2023, was Vietnam Veterans Memorial Day. It marks the day that the last US combat troops left Vietnam. Hard to believe that it has been 50 years since I came home.

The truce that ended the fighting between US troops and NVA troops was signed in January 1973. During February and March, the POWs held by North Vietnam were released and flown home.

#### NOTES FROM THE VA REPRESENTATIVE

#### Masks

The VA, including the Lincoln Community-Base Outpatient Clinic (CBOC), no longer requires the wearing of masks to enter clinics. Masks are available for those who still wish to wear them.

#### **PACT Act**

On August 10, 2022, President Biden signed the PACT Act into law, extending VA health eligibility and benefits to many veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances. This PACT Act now PRESUMES that exposure to toxic substances caused many health problems for those who served in these theaters.

If you have filed a claim for Agent Orange, etc., or other toxics and it was denied, you need to file a claim update and get a new review. For me, my service in Thailand is now covered for toxic exposures. It allows me to file new claims for many of my health problems, without needing to prove my service caused them.

If you have not filed a claim under the PACT Act, go to the Veterans Affairs web site. There you will find answers to your questions about what the PACT Act means for you or your loved ones. You can also call us at 800-698-2411 (TTY: 711). And you can file a claim for PACT Act-related disability compensation or apply for VA health care now.

If you are awarded a new disability or have one upgraded, you will or should receive back pay to September 2022.

If you had service in Vietnam or the Middle East, visit the VA web site and read the list of medical problems that are now presumed to have a link to service in these theaters. If you have any, contact your Service Office to file a new or updated claim. I was able to file claims for four medical problems that are now covered by this change.

#### **Advance Directives**

One of the forms that the VA would like to have on file for all veterans who use its hospitals and clinics is an Advance Directive Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care and Living Will. Form VA 10-0137 can be picked up at your local clinic or hospitals. This form allows you to inform the VA whom you might wish to make health care decisions in the event that you become disabled and cannot do so. Filing this form is not required, but it might be something that you may want to think about.

#### LINCOLN AREA YOUTH PICKED TO ATTEND **BOYS' STATE AND GIRLS' STATE**

Cornhusker Boys' State and Cornhusker Girls State, educational programs sponsored by the Nebraska American Legion and Nebraska American Legion Auxiliary that teach about city, county, and state government in a nonpartisan manner, remain two of the best-known and most respected projects associated with the American Legion Family.

Thirteen young men and twenty-three young women from the Lincoln area were chosen to be among the approximately 240 high school junior boys and 300 high school junior girls scheduled to attend the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary's 2023 sessions of Cornhusker Boys State and Cornhusker Girls State. The week-long events are scheduled to begin on Sunday, June 4th on the University of Nebraska-Lincoln campus.

The delegates will have hands-on learning as they hold their own elections for public office, legislature, and court systems while participating as citizens of their mythical towns. Students selected to attend must have demonstrated good scholastic records, leadership qualities, honesty, and good character.

Lincoln's American Legion Post 3 and American Legion Auxiliary Unit 3 and other area Legion or Auxiliary units sponsor (endorse) the Lincoln area boys and girls who are scheduled to attend --- and contributed the enrollment fee for some. 
