Claims filed by veterans as of Oct. 22 for VA benefits and health care authorized under the American Legion-supported Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act (PACT Act) that was signed into law Aug. 10. The law expands eligibility for benefits to veterans affected by burn-pit exposure, Agent Orange in previously unrecognized locations, atomic radiation and other contamination.
