We are also facing challenges with transportation. Reaching the marketplace, hospital, schools, and nearby villages for ministry work has become difficult. We currently depend on borrowed or irregular transport, which affects our children's needs and our daily activities.

Along with this, we continue to pray for a water purification machine because our children are still drinking public water, which we also use for cooking. Our electricity connection is also not stable. The wiring and cables around the meter are damaged, and we require new wiring to ensure proper supply to the building. We also need regular support for cooking gas supplies to prepare daily meals.

3. Current Challenges

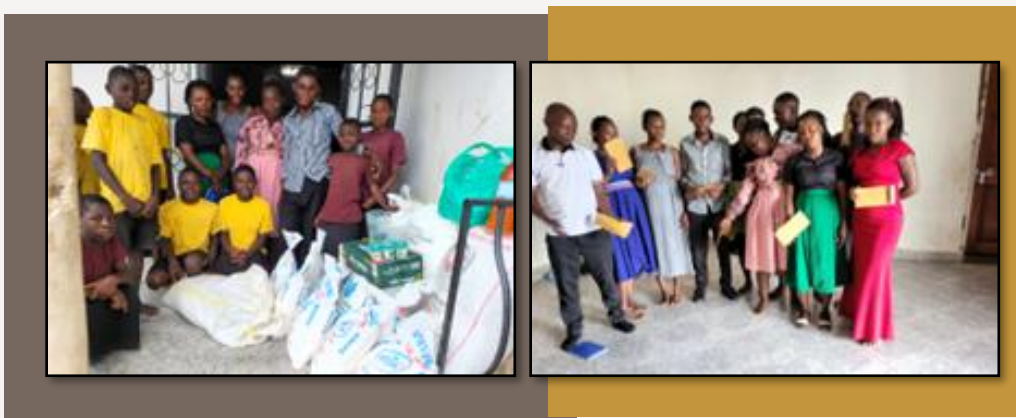
