What:	A <u>one-time</u> resource of \$100 of free groceries and delivery. Volunteers do the shopping for the clients
When/where:	Once registered, the client would provide the grocery list to the office which would handle the shopping and delivery between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on a weekday

Who:	CT Residents. Residents from any town may go to any mobile food pantry. The closest pantries for Branford residents are generally held in Clinton, East Haven and Hamden
What:	Pre-packed food. Drive thru or take-away groceries in pre-packed bags.
When/where:	Schedule – Be sure to double check the web site (https://www.ctfoodbank.org/get-help/connecticut-food-banks-mobile-pantry-schedule/) for any last minute changes: East Haven: 3rd Thursdays of each month at 4pm – 5 p.m. East Haven High School, 35 Wheelbarrow Ln, East Haven Clinton: 1st Fridays of each month at 9:30 a.m. Clinton Town Hall Annex, 48 E Main St, Clinton Old Saybrook: 4 th Thursdays of each month at 10:00 a.m. First Church of Christ in Saybrook, 366 Main Street, Old Saybrook The Mobil Food Pantry also stops at least once a month in Hamden as well as sites in New Haven . Be sure to check the web site for the monthly schedules.

More info:	The distribution is a drive through pickup system, and participants must be able to get groceries into their own vehicles without assistance for everyone's safety. If that is not possible, the pantry directors request that clients send someone on their behalf or bring a household member for assistance.

Who:	Home bound senior residents age 60 and over of Greater New Haven including East Haven, North Haven Branford, and North Branford/Northford. Note: there is a waiting list.
What:	Hot meals delivered. Meals can be prepared according to a doctor's recommendation.
When/where:	Deliveries to homes 5 days a week, Monday – Friday.
How:	Apply to add name to waiting list. (203) 752-9919. For East Haven, North Haven and Branford, getting service (a meal box delivered once a week with 5 frozen meals) may be faster by contacting the town senior centers.

Who:	North Haven householders showing proof of residency. Advance registration is required.
What:	Monthly Food Bag: Pre-packed groceries once every 30 days – one large recyclable shopping bag full. Note, During Summer 2022, The Department of Community Services will have Farmers' Market Coupons, available according to financial need. Advance registration is required.
When/where:	Pick-ups are scheduled by appointment set between 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on weekdays; the bags are pre-packed, labeled for the family and set outside for pickup. Town Hall Annex Building at 5 Linsley Street, North Haven
How:	Reservations are required one day in advance. (203) 239-5321 x500. If a senior needs transportation to the Food Bank or would like a home delivery for those that are homebound please call the Senior Center (203) 239-5432

Who:	Residents of North Haven aged 60+. As the meals are provided through Life Bridge services, residents who are already served by Lifebridge Community Services (see Meals on Wheels) and already receive meals in senior congregate housing are not eligible.
What:	Two programs: 1. Boxed Meals: Tuesdays Pick-ups Recipients are required to call the Center at (203) 239-5432 on the Wednesday prior to the next delivery to make reservations. Or, if you are not going to be home and you reserved a home delivery for your boxed meals you are asked to call the office to make other arrangements. For May – every week; In June the summer schedule may be reduced to every other week 2. Transportation to pick up a Monthly Food Bag at the Community Services Food Bank: If you need transportation or would like a home delivery for those that are homebound please call the Center (203) 239-5432
