AGM NEWS:

Due to the inevitable rise in expenses, the club has been subsidising the members by about \$35.00 each per year. To address the problem, one of the tasks for the AGM was to set the subscription fees for the next membership year that commences on 1st July 2026. At the meeting on August 20th, the new fees were agreed as follows:

Individual = \$100

Family of 2 = \$190 (\$95 per person)

Family of 3 = \$270 (\$90 per person)

Family of 4 = \$340 (\$85 per person)

Family of 5 = \$400 (\$80 per person)
