No mystery here, **Catherine Fiddelears** has finished making her horse. His name is Nugget.


Following the request by **Stuart Grierson**, for some bonsai stands, **Don Buchanan** has sent me this photo of two stands, made by **Simon King.**

**COMPUTER ASSISTED WOODWORK:** Help is at hand for those members who would like to try out some of the latest technology, newly acquired by the club thanks to the generosity of **David Walker**. Go-to members in this field are **David Walker**, **Ron Bolton** and **Ross Blackwood**, who are happy to give advice and instruction to help de-mystify the process of using a CNC machine. Planning a 3D model design that is suitable to be made on the CNC machine requires some tuition which David is happy to give and is available most days except Thursday. David prefers to teach no more than one or two Members at a time. Everyone is welcome to avail themselves of this.

**ANOTHER CLUB CHALLENGE**. This grand old lady has been brought into the workshop for a facelift. I'm looking forward to seeing how she turns out.

**ANOTHER REMINDER:** Our first-aid kits are being inspected to check use-by dates and to ensure they are well stocked. We are reminded to ask for help if it is needed, especially if blood is involved. Blood stains must be avoided wherever possible and cleaned up immediately if they happen.

**AN OLD REMEDY THAT WORKS**. Going through some back copies of the club's newsletter I found this item that had been submitted by **Chris Drysdale** in August 2008. I thought it worth another look. See what you think.

A Method for Drying Green Wood. Green turned bowls 6" to 14" in diameter from logs, using liquid dishwashing soap as a drying method. As stupid as it sounds, the process works well on large diameter pieces.

### The process:

- 1. Rough turn the piece, then totally immerse in liquid dish soap for a minimum 48 hours.
- 2. If you are able to afford the time, go for 2 weeks as this dramatically reduces further movement and cracking.
- 3. After 2 weeks remove, drain, and let thoroughly air dry, about 7 to ten days.
- 4. Return piece to the lathe, shape, sand, and finish.
- 5. You might want to try one piece.
- 6. Problems you might have are finding a container deep enough to hold that amount of liquid and weighting the piece down.
- 7. 3 weeks to a month is a lot shorter than waiting a year.

Thanks again Chris. I wonder if anyone tried this method?


