THE KIMBE PROJECT NEWS: From time to time over the past several years, Berwick District Woodworkers has been collecting tools and machinery to donate to the Kimbe Project. We first learned of the project through a visit from Barbara & Adrian Corkeron who came to to

project through a visit from Barbara & Adrian Corkeron who came to tell us about a school in Kimbe, Papua New Guinea, that they support. The school was an empty building, supplied by the Papuan Government to the people of Kimbe. Efforts by various supporters have since supplied the necessary school equipment. Donations are packed into shipping containers and transported to New Guinea, where they are unpacked and distributed under the watchful supervision of Barbara & Adrian who travel to meet the container upon its arrival. Following are some excerpts and photos from the latest Kimbe Project Report with news of Container No. 9.

"We opened the container on Saturday 30 August and then started to sort out the contents. We sorted the boxes into groups of primary schools, individual high schools, health clinics and parishes.


For interest, the container was loaded with 1390 boxes of books, 20 x Kindergarten tables and 40 chairs, walking frames, 250 Days for Girls Kits, crutches, a sewing machine, 9 x "All in One" computers, a pallet load of tools for the Tech School and a statue for the new St. Joseph High School at Valupai (a village). All in all it was a good trip, very satisfying and the people were extremely grateful."


