AUGUST SHOW AND TELL.

Chris Drysdale showed us some work that he has done using his CNC machine. At right are some coasters cut from Merbau. Here's what Chris savs.



"The coaster has been cut out on my CNC machine from a 42mm piece of Merbau timber and the small seahorse is carved from beech that fits nicely into the drink bottle opening, it will be raised off the bottom and when the resin is filled to just cover the seahorse it will give an interesting 3D effect." Chris will use leftovers from the cut-outs for pen blanks and other small items.



Below, also cut from Merbau and awaiting their curved blades, are some handles for the herb cutters that are favoured by TV cook, Nigella Lawson.



John McMahon showed us the finished vase that he used to demonstrate his Dremel work at the club's recent Expo. The base, outer vase and inner cup were made up from 3 pieces of Arizona Cypress that were given to John by a friend. The pieces were turned, shaped with an Arbortech, etched with the Dremel and finally glued together.







The little doll was made by Rick and Elsie Hoare. Rick turned the head and limbs while Elsie fitted them to a soft, stuffed body and added the painted features, hair and clothing.

Our membership continues to grow driven by the exposure to the public through our Expo,


farmers markets and word of mouth.
