Course Duration: 3 hours

# Module 1: Introduction to Public Speaking (1 hour)

### 3. Organizing Thoughts and Speech Structure:

### 3. Feedback and Improvement:

- b. Activity: After each presentation, peers provide positive feedback and suggest areas for improvement
