Module 1: Introduction to Presentation Tools (1 hour)

1. Why Presentations Matter:

a. Discussion on the importance of effective presentations in school, work, and everyday life



b. Examples of great presentations and what makes them engaging

2. Getting Started with PowerPoint and Canva:

- a. Overview of PowerPoint: Slide creation, adding text, images, and transitions
- b. Overview of Canva: Designing visually appealing slides, templates, and customization options
- c. Activity: Students will familiarize themselves with the interface of both tools and create a basic slide with a title, image, and text

Module 2: Structuring Your Presentation (1 hour)

- b. Discussion on the importance of not overloading slides with information (keep it simple and clear)
- c. Activity: Add a relevant image or graphic to each slide to support their main idea

Module 3: Presenting Your Work (1 hour)

1. Public Speaking Tips and Techniques:



- a. Discuss the basics of speaking confidently: Posture, tone, eye contact, and pacing
- b. Activity: Practice speaking clearly and confidently about their slides (without reading directly from them)

2. Rehearsing the Presentation:

- a. Students will practice presenting their slides to the group
- b. Focus on smooth transitions between slides, staying on topic, and engaging the audience
- c. Peer feedback: After each presentation, students will give positive feedback to one another

3. Final Presentations:

- a. Each student will present their mini-project to the group using the slides they created
- b. Time for each student to present: 3-5 minutes per person
- c. Feedback: Group and instructor provide constructive feedback on presentation skills, design, and content
