DATES: This course is a full day format running from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM each day from **July 18**st to **20**th, **2023**

LOCATION: Strickland Building, 675 Strickland Lane, on the campus of the Maritime College of Forest Technology, Fredericton NB. The college has formal teaching and 'hands on' areas, as well as outdoor areas for practical sessions.
