We, the undersigned agree to have the Board deduct stumpage payments from the Contractor to be paid to the Woodlot Owner at the stumpage rates below for all forest products sold through contracts held by the Board. The Contractor must identify on each mill scale slip the above property identification number (PID), and Woodlot Owner to whom the stumpage is to be paid.

- (1) Payment is to be made no later than the week following delivery. All stumpage payments are to be deducted by the Board, with offices in Fredericton, NB, and St. Stephen, NB. Mill scale is the basis for payment and the Contractor must supply a copy of each scale slip they have received for wood delivered from the property each week. All conversion factors are as stated in the most recent "New Brunswick Forest Products Commission Accepted Conversion Factors".

- (2) This Contract is limited to the property(ies) with the following P.I.D. number(s):

 If the Contract is limited to a part of the property or properties, attach a sketch showing boundary lines, reference points such as streams, roads etc., with the agreed area of the harvest clearly drawn.

- (3) The Contractor will ensure that they, and all employees working on the Woodlot Owner's property are covered in case of injury or death by a valid insurance policy or under the New Brunswick Workers Compensation Act.

- (4) The Contractor agrees that all road maintenance or construction will be done as part of the job at their own expense, and will be done in accordance with the pertinent Provincial regulations, unless otherwise specified.

- (5) Property lines are to be left clear of slash and no line trees are to be cut. The Contractor will ensure that harvesting does not exceed the boundaries of the property, regardless of the condition of the boundary lines.

- (6) The terms of this contract are subject to review prior to any future cutting that may take place on this property.

- (7) All harvesting is to be completed by (date) _____, at which time all harvested wood is to be removed from the Woodlot Owner's property.

- (8) Stump height will not exceed 12 inches, and all trees shall be limbed out to a 3" top. All merchantable trees that are cut or damaged shall be removed to the landing.

- (9) Best Management Practices. A copy of this manual is provided by YSC. The Contractor should review the manual and ensure that their practices follow those outlined in the manual.

- (11) **The Buyer and the Woodlot Owner agree that the Board is not a party to this contract. The Board acts only as a holder of this contract for reference and implementation, and there is therefore no contractual relationship between the Board and either the Buyer and/or the Woodlot Owner.**
