Epiphany: Following the Light

Dear Friends,

As we enter into the season of Epiphany, we are invited to pay attention. We are called to notice where God is being revealed in our lives and in our world. The word “epiphany” means manifestation or appearing. It is a gentle reminder that God is not hidden away, but here, with us, showing up in unexpected places and surprising ways.

When we think of Epiphany, we often picture the story of the Magi. Those travelers who came from far away, following a star that they didn’t really understand. They trusted the light enough to move, to journey, to risk being changed by what they would find. When they arrived, they discovered that God’s presence wasn’t found in power or money, but in love and humility. Epiphany calls us to ask similar questions of ourselves.

Where is God’s light shining in our own lives?

What stars are we being called to follow?


How is God revealed through the people we meet, through the love we share, and through our eyes opened to the situations around us?

This season reminds us that faith isn’t about having all of the answers, but in being open to wonder, to change, and to see the ways that God works among us and through us. The light of Christ shines not just for a few, but for all of us. We are called to be that light in the world.

As we move through Epiphany, may we notice the light, follow it faithfully, and reflect it into our world that longs for hope.



December Consistory Digest

There were 10 members present including Brad Arnold and Pastor Amy Fawks.

Treasurer's Report:

General pledge November 2025: \$6,981.91

General pledge November 2024: \$7,461.00

YTD income: \$154,334.76

YTD expenses: \$225,686.19

YTD deficit: \$71,351.43

Brad Arnold reported, to date, donations to general pledge have been approximately \$62,000. This is about \$4000 to \$5000 less than last year. This decrease has been the trend for the past several years. Current expenditures are in line with the 2025 budget.

The trustees reported Grace now has an 8ft. ladder rated at 250 lbs. It is stored in the closet behind the altar. This is where the other one used to be kept.

Vickie Arnold recommended a Hospitality Committee be formed in 2026.

Pastor Amy mentioned there have been no volunteers for a Stewardship Committee.

Pastor's report:

SPECIAL WORSHIP:

- Bible study on Wednesdays has begun again.
- The sanctuary is open every Wednesday from 11am-12pm for quiet prayers.
- There will be a Blue Christmas (Longest Night) service on Dec. 20th at 7pm.
- All Saints Sunday went well on Nov. 2nd.
- Thanksgiving Eve service went well—it was a joint service with Trinity Hanover and Trinity Gettysburg. **We collected \$312 for God's Meal Barrel.**

CONTINUING EDUCATION:

- I finished my 11th course on November 19
- I will have 4 more in January-March 2026. (This will put me at 15 out of my 18 courses needed. The remaining three will be held in April, September, and January 2027)
- I continue to reach out and make connections with the community and other local pastors.

THINGS TO NOTE:

- I will be taking vacation days as we finish out 2025. My plan is to be out of the office on 12/11, 12/18, 12/23, 12/29-12/31. I will be available by phone if any needs arise.
- January, February, and March, I will have class on Mondays at 7:00.
- **Regional Conference Minister Rev. David Ackerman will be at Grace on January 18th. He will be giving the sermon that day.**

Summary of the November 16th Grace Annual Meeting Minutes

The meeting was held Sunday November 16, 2025, with 34 in attendance.

The 2026 Grace Proposed Budget of \$287,326.00 was approved by the congregation.

The congregation voted to approve the revised Grace UCC By-laws.

2026 Grace Consistory:

Angie Boyers was nominated to the Consistory during the meeting to give the Consistory the 9 members needed as shown in the By-laws.

Keystone Conference Fall Budget Meeting November 22, 2025, by Zoom

It was determined that at least 150 congregations were represented to establish a quorum.

Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, Executive Conference Minister, hosted the meeting.

There was introduction of the new conference board members, who were appointed until the Annual Conference meeting which will be held June 5-7 at Millersville University.

There was introduction of conference staff members. Rev. David Ackerman, from Latrobe, PA, will be the Region III conference minister. The Gettysburg Association is now in Region III which is the western part of PA.

The Keystone Conference office will be at St. Thomas UCC, Linglestown, PA. Contacts for conference staff will be sent out in early 2026. There will be a new website: keystoneeuc.org.

The 2026 proposed Keystone Conference budget showed \$2,006,771. The 2025 expenses, which were calculated by combining the prior 4 conferences', 2025 expenses, showed \$2,575,787. The budget vote was: 262 yea, 10 nay, 2 abstain.

Rev. Dr. Call shared that there will be two priority conference outreach projects during the next two years. One, is continued giving for Our Churches Wider Mission (OCWM) and People at the Table.

OCWM funds are donations made by congregations to go to support the conferences and UCC national offices and missions. The Keystone Conference will donate 10% of its budget (\$200,000) to the national UCC.


People at the Table is a new project that will address food insecurity in Pennsylvania as a whole conference. The conference staff is planning on meeting with the governor and agriculture secretary of PA. Updates will follow.


