He left that place and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. ²On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! ³Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. ⁴Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house." ⁵And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them.

⁶And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. ⁷He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. ⁸He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; ⁹but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. ¹⁰He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. ¹¹If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." ¹²So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. ¹³They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

I have always been facinated with this text from Mark. A prophet is never welcome among the people who know them. That which is familiar can't be from God. Right? But then, I think about our current situation here at Grace, and ponder, am I accepted by those who know me? Can I be their pastor? I am NOT claiming to be a prophet or like Jesus. However, I do wish to thank you for allowing me to come and visit you. These are the times when pastors get to know the people of the church on

a deeper level. There never seems to be enough time to do this at church on a Sunday morning.

When I read this text, I realize how diffucult it is to truly follow Christ. Not only do we need to pick up our crosses, we carry them with extrelemly limited resources. Jesus told his disciples to take nothing with them excpet a walking staff. The point, when we walk with Jesus, all we need is to rest on him. As we journey through this Season after Pentecost, may we be willing to put aside all life's distractions, and follow lightly into the unknown. Jesus is waiting.
