Due to copyright restrictions, our worship service live streaming will be slightly different and effective immediately. At 10am, the first contemporary song will be posted to the Grace Facebook page. (The in-person worship will hear the announcements, prelude, and the contemporary song.) Live streaming will begin with the call to worship. The rest of the service will be live streamed until the end of the message. The video associated with the message and the final contemporary song will be posted on the Grace Facebook page at approximately 10:50. (The inperson worship will then watch that video, sing with the contemporary song, and sing the Choral Benediction). Please be sure to turn on Live Stream notifications for Grace's Facebook page. The Sunday bulletin can be found on the Grace website under the "Weekly Mailers" tab. Within the weekly mailer, you will find the bulletin and the announcements that were read at the beginning of the worship service. While we miss worshiping with you in person, hopefully these changes will help you to still feel connected to the worship service. Grace January 2024 Annual Meeting Digest

Dave Fawks called the meeting to order at 11:11 AM, on January 28, in the sanctuary. There were 31 members in attendance.

Amy Fawks opened the meeting with a prayer.

President's Report

Dave asked the congregation to review his "Consistory President's Report" found on Pages 4 and 5 of the Annual Report. He went on to say change can happen and it is up to us. He asked the congregation what is our passion? Who do we want to be? He reviewed some event highlights at Grace from 2023.

Dave said the congregation will be forming a Pastor Relations Committee and Transition Ministry Team.

Rev. Fred Young Comments

Pastor Young spoke to the congregation about the Pastor Relations Committee and Transition Ministry Team. The Pastor Relations Committee will be a liaison between the congregation and the pastor. The Transition Ministry Team will review where Grace has been, where we are now, and look at dreams moving forward. This team will hold Town Hall meetings to get input from the congregation.

Treasurer's Report

Carroll Miller highlighted some of his comments found in the "2023 Treasurer's Overview Report," found on Page 6 of the Annual Report. He mentioned some other areas of interest:

Comparison of Giving Income versus Expenses for the past three years.

Year	Income	Expenses
2021	\$122,932	\$216,549
2022	\$117,202	\$234,321
2023	\$83,447	\$220,374

Carroll said most of the expenses are fixed such as salaries and utilities. Carroll was able to find another electricity supplier which reduced Grace's electricity expense by approximately 50%. He also stated we are now using some of the principal in these funds which will reduce the amount we have available for investment to pay expenses. Carroll said there are currently only two people on the Finance Committee, Linda Bixler and himself. He asked for more volunteers to serve on the committee.

The congregation approved the 2024 Budget of \$219,000.

Consistory

Dave Fawks recognized Tom Craig and Mike Mummert for their past service to Grace and the Consistory. Dave presented the following slate of candidates for the Grace 2024 Consistory: Vickie Arnold, Craig Bixler, Becky Boyer, Susan Dienes, Fay Emlet, Dave Fawks, Joleen Fennell, Glendon Ruhlman, and Dan Trimmer. All nine candidates were approved to serve in 2024.

Old Business

Mary Jane Fuhrman expressed her concern that she cannot see the painting of Jesus because the screen in the sanctuary blocks her view.

New Business

A visitor asked if the congregation has considered putting solar panels on the sanctuary roof.

February 2024 Consistory Digest

There were 11 members present including Pastor Fred, Amy Fawks, Carroll Miller, and Patti Miller.

Treasurer's report:

General pledge January 2024: \$5,092 General pledge January 2023: \$7,001 YTD income: \$11,960 YTD expenses: \$15,827 YTD deficit: \$3,867

Checking account balances:

- -- Operating Fund: \$57,546 -- Deacon Fund: \$16,040 -- Education Fund: \$14,142
- -- Memorial Fund: \$9,716

Carroll Miller reported the month's expenses totaled \$15,827.00 while we had budgeted \$18,059.00. Pledge giving's of \$5,092 were \$9,062 below what we needed to break even. This combination resulted in a deficit of \$3,867.00. We did help a family through the Deacon Fund and used \$1,410 from the Zeigler Estate Funds to pay repairs and maintenance.

Amy Fawks reported for Worship & Music: Due to copyright, the livestream will begin after the first modern song and end after the sermon. The videos will be published at comparable times on Facebook to "complete" the worship experience. CCLI licensing information is now shown at the end of the hymns. Christian will be looking at interest in starting a choir.

Amy Fawks presented a proposal from Reynold's AV to upgrade AV equipment in the sanctuary.

The Reynold's quote was discussed. During the discussion, it was suggested Pastor Whittier's old computer be moved to the balcony which would save \$1500. Also, Amy recommended Grace try the robotic camera. Using the old computer along with purchasing the robotic camera will adjust Reynold's quote to \$6700. A congregational meeting will be held to discuss the upgrades and vote on the expenditure.

Patti Miller reported: During January I made 19 visits to senior care facilities and homes and three hospital visits. There are currently 23 total members who for various reasons are unable to attend worship physically. Some of our members prefer a phone call or a card to a visit, so I make sure to spend time in conversation with them. I made over 40 phone calls to stay in touch with shut-ins, to arrange visits, and to keep in touch with family members.

Outreach Committee reported:

- Cards for people in the service, college students, off-site saints, and Grace members we have not seen recently, will be signed after the February 25 worship service in the nursery.
- During March, the committee is collecting snack items for goody bags to be donated to fire & police departments, hospital ER, school bus companies, etc. The assembly date will be late March.
- Plans are being made for another car show, possibly May 4 or May 11.
- For many years Grace had been a "5 for 5 UCC Church." Being 5 for 5 means that our church is a leader, providing support to Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) and the Special Mission Offerings: One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need and The Christmas Fund. Grace currently still donates to OCWM. There was discussion about once again donating to One Great Hour of Sharing and Neighbors in Need.

Pastor Fred reported:

- Ther newly created Transition Ministry Team was presented for Consistory approval. The team members are: Brad and Vickie Arnold, Rick and Becky Boyer, Susan Dienes, Pam Kreitz, Judy Rummel, and Holly Smith. The team members were approved by the Consistory.
- Pastor Fred will be searching for people to be on the Pastoral Relation's Committee.
- The outdoor front sign facing Fourth Street should be changed to show "Transition Ministry Team" with the names Rev. Dr. Fred Young, Amy Fawks, and Patti Miller showing.
- Pastor Fred would like to hold staff meetings once a month.

Dave Fawks, President's report:

- Committees and committee personnel were discussed during the meeting. Committees with no activity were removed from the agenda and new ones added for 2024.
- After some discussion, it was decided to hold future Consistory meetings the second Monday of each month at 6 PM.
- Piano moving: Christian Keller and Scott Fredericks have stated that when playing duets with the piano and organ they cannot see each other. Christian checked into what it would cost to move the piano up to the choir loft. He said he knows of a company that does this and would cost about \$650. The area where the piano is now would become the new place where the choir would sing.

The Consistory discussed the matter and decided to gather information about moving the piano. A positive vote by the Consistory to move the piano will be referred to the congregation for approval.
