

October Consistory Digest

There were 11 members present including Pastor Amy and Rick Boyer.

Treasurer's Report:

Rick Boyer budget comments:

• Reviewed the Grace Balance Sheet as of September 30.

- \$20,000 was removed from Wilmington Trust Investments to pay bills.
- Presented the Grace 2026 Proposed Budget showing the total for all expenses of \$286,326.00, which is a 3% to 4% increase over 2025.

Vickie Arnold reported, to date, there has not been a replacement found for Glendon Ruhlman for the 2026 Consistory.

The Consistory approved the Grace Employee Handbook that was presented for review last month. The new handbook will be in use beginning January 1, 2026.

Trustees:

- Work done by George H. Bixler, Inc.:
 - ➤ Parsonage Burham hot water boiler serviced September 10th
 - ➤ Opened left rear downspout drain at front inset between sanctuary and Education Wing, repaired toilet on third floor ladies' room, repaired faucet in nursery, September 22nd
 - ➤ Checked left downspout drain at front entrance and first downspout drain on N. Franklin St. side with camera. No breaks found in pipes. A lot of roofing nails and some shingle gravel present. (September 30th)
 - > Opened right downspout drain to the right of the Fourth Street front entrance. Downspout cut to make a cleanout. (October 1st)
- Tim Hagarman replaced the rusted electrical conduit on the back of Education Wing with plastic conduit
- Heidler Roofing repaired the northwest gutter on the sanctuary. The gutter hangers were strengthened. This gutter has a history of getting pushed out from the roof. This is the northwest corner and ice may be a problem in the winter. Heidler also repaired the downspout at the rear of the Education Wing closest to North Franklin Street. A metal funnel was fabricated to direct the water into the round drainpipe

Pastor Amy reported the elevator was inspected and should be up to date for state certification.

Microsoft has ended support for Windows 10. New computers with Windows 11 should be purchased for better speed and security. Pastor Amy presented a quote from 1st Choice Computer Solutions:

• \$2,079.98 for Lenovo ThinkPad E16 16" Notebook/Laptop, Dell Pro QCS1250 Desktop Computer, and computers installation and data transfer

The Consistory approved the expenditure.

Another quote from 1st Choice Computers for \$1,695.00 for network cleanup in order to get equipment off the floor by installing a wall rack was approved. Recently a wire got hot that caused phone and internet problems at Grace. The wall rack should help eliminate the problem.

- I begin my 11th course, October 15 through November 19)
- My lay ministerial standing is now good for the length of my time at Grace until ordination. I do not need to get it renewed every year

Other

- The councilors from Wike would like to know where the on/off switch is for the parking lot lights.
- Proposed idea: Offer a church opportunity and community outreach Open the church for prayer: Mondays or Wednesdays 11am-12pm. It would be a small cost of having the lights on in the sanctuary during that hour

The Consistory approved opening the church for one hour on Wednesdays as long as Pastor Amy feels safe.

There was Consistory discussion about improving the parking lot lights. Susan Dienes reported some kids are sometimes in the parking lot late at night. It was suggested lights with sensors be purchased for the parking lot.

Vickie Arnold reported that a Gunn-Mowery Insurance agent was at Grace, October 8, 2025, to review our insurance policy with Utica. The agent was satisfied with the overall appearance of the building.

After some changes to the renewal, the premium was reduced by 5.5% for 2026.
