A letter from the Pastor...

It has been a few weeks since our last town hall conversation and I have had some time to reflect on what was discussed; hopefully, you have too. After reviewing the inner workings of the transition/interim journey, we opened the floor for comments shared on our hopes and dreams clothesline. Some shared their hopes for Grace while others listed concerns. Both were addressed. What I believe we discovered during this time of open sharing was that we all have hopes for Grace and the future of this church.

Personal expectations during these town halls are never fully expressed or understood, but such sharing leads to a deeper view of what needs to happen next on the journey of change and calling. A concern that appeared on several pieces of laundry expressed the desire to move on and select a new pastor for Grace. I have shared on many occasions that there is a very real pastor shortage happening throughout mainline churches. Congregations in transition have been asked to be creative in their search for a new pastor. The yoking of Trinity and Grace is an example of such innovation.

Congregations have begun seeking leadership from within to fill the pulpit, identifying lay members who demonstrate pastoral skills. It should not come as a surprise that Amy and I have been talking about her gifts for ministry since my arrival. Amy is now a Member in Discernment within the Gettysburg Association and with her Pennsylvania Academy of Ministry classes, she is on a similar ordination path that you all supported me through over 20 years ago. You might recall I too worked here at Grace as a seminarian with our youth and Sunday school as well as visiting our homebound. I truly appreciated the support and experiences I enjoyed here at Grace.

Now, Grace has another opportunity to nurture the call of one of your members. Amy Fawks has already been providing pastoral leadership over the past year of transition. However, her leadership stems back ten years before when she became our Director of Modern Worship. Amy has been a servant of Christ and a servant of Grace and now wishes to expand this servanthood through the process of ordination. I cannot tell you how excited I am to be the pastor who is encouraging and supporting Amy as Bruce and Rita Bouchard supported me.

I am asking that Grace embrace Amy the way you championed me, Erin Snell, Scott Sager, Jeffery Stonesifer and Theron Snyder. The call is personal and public. First you need to accept that God is calling you to something other in your life; then you require the nurturing and support of others along the journey. Amy has heard the call! May Grace celebrate its 6th child of the church.

Kleinginna Education Fund

The Grace Church Kleinginna Educational Fund was established on May 8, 1983 to honor Rev. John A. Kleinginna, Pastor Emeritus of Grace UCC on the 50th anniversary of his ordination into ministry. The funds are to be used for the education of a student in the area of Christian education with first priority given to ministerial students. The funds would not be limited to any specific use and could be used by the student to further his/her education in ways deemed necessary.

The fund has been used to fund the ministerial education of Scott Sager, Erin Snell, Fred Young, and Bruce Bouchard.

Money for this fund was received from donations in honor of Rev. Kleinginna, special offering envelopes, and fundraisers. No offering envelopes have been used in the past several years since there was not a need for the funds.

The Kleinginna Education Fund has 2 separate accounts and is not part of the general fund. It is divided into an investment account and an educational fund checking account. Currently the checking account has \$13,444.67 and the investment account has \$28,100.72.

Amy Fawks has begun her journey to become an ordained minister. She has been approved as a Member in Discernment with the Gettysburg Association of the Penn Central Association of the United Church of Christ. Her advisor is Rev. Ken Peterkin who is pastor at Emmanual UCC in Hanover. Amy's great-great grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Wisensale, were charter members of Grace when it was established in 1906.

Amy is presently taking the courses required toward ordained ministry. She has completed 2 of the 18 courses needed and is presently working on her third course. Each course costs \$350. Amy will be using some of the Kleinginna Education Fund towards the cost of her course work.



There were 11 members present including Rev. Young and Amy Fawks.

Treasurer's Report:

A collection for the Deacon's Fund will be advertised for the month of November.

Vickie Arnold reported there will be two openings for the 2025 Consistory. David Fawks will be completing his second 3-year term. Fay Emlet will be completing her first 3-year term and opting not to return. Several congregation members were mentioned for consideration as replacements

The Personnel Committee updated the Sexton Job Description. After some discussion, the job description was approved as presented.

Dave Fawks reported:

The ceiling tiles for Fellowship Hall have been purchased and are currently being installed.

The security lights in the building have had batteries replaced and are now working.

Bill Trump was at Grace with the asbestos abatement company to review the tile floor replacement job in Fellowship Hall. Dave will contact Bill Trump to see if the floor in Fellowship Hall can be replaced in October before the potential November 9 Gettysburg Association pot luck event.

Amy Fawks reported for the worship & Music committee:

We discussed ways to make Grace more welcoming to visitors.

Harvest Home will be October 13th and we will celebrate World Wide Communion on that date.

All Saint's Sunday will be November 3rd.

Outreach Committee: The Christmas Eve offering will go to Hoffman Homes. Approval was given for Grace to participate in Hanover Borough's October 22 Trick or Treat Night.

Rev. Young reported:

The Transition Team will meet on Monday, September 16th to discuss the Town Hall and to plan our next congregational gathering.

<u>Pastoral Relations</u> team met again on September 4, 2024 and will continue to meet once a month for the duration of the transition period. Members of this team: Becky Boyer, Jen Weaver and Charlie Fennell.

<u>The Spiritual Council</u> and the <u>Pastoral Relations team</u> met on August 21st to discuss Consistory's letter to Patti Miller. We determined that since an email was sent by Patti to only a few folks at Grace on May 1, 2024, the content of that email made it a moot point to send Patti another letter.

Other:

- Visitation Training will begin in September and will run for 5 weeks.
- Dave and I have talked about a possible Property Committee.
- I have visited each member on our homebound list this summer that welcomes visitors.
- Amy Fawks is now an official Member in Discernment within the Gettysburg Association. She is seeking ordination within the United Church of Christ. The small Committee that has been asked to work with Amy had their first meeting on September 8th.
- It has become apparent that open and honest communication needs to be continually addressed here at Grace. The habit of having a few folks knowing what is happening has not worked in the past and will continue to not work in the future. Who is in and Who is out at Grace?

Rev Young reported during the meeting:

Any time a Consistory member receives an email or hears about anything that could be harmful to the congregation; it must be made known immediately.

Len Bankert has agreed to serve on the Property Committee.

I will be away for a retreat the second week in October. I will not miss the Sunday. I will be away visiting the last week in October. There will most likely be a video sermon October 27.

Under *New Business* there was discussion centered on Amy Fawks being considered as an Associate Pastor at Grace. There was some concern that the congregation needs more information regarding Amy's training and courses for this position. There was also concern about the recent comments hung on the clothe line.

Moving forward: Rev. Young will write a letter to the congregation mentioning an Associate Pastor can be ordained or not ordained. It will also explain some of the requirements Amy has met and some of her current courses as she pursues becoming an ordained minister. The Consistory will vote on Amy's title at the October Consistory meeting. The Consistory decision will be sent to the congregation for a vote no later than mid-November.
