I like the word "expectation." It means a strong belief that something will happen or be the case in the future.

All of us are growing older, and at this time of the year we may find ourselves looking back at the past and ahead to the future and evaluating our expectations. We may find some disappointments, but I pray that you also find much joy - both in your past memories and in what you are anticipating in the future

You see, Simeon and Anna both must have experienced disappointments and hardships. Anna was a widow and in Jesus' time would have needed to rely on charity and the goodwill of others to meet her daily needs. Both Simeon and Anna trusted in God and in God's promises. Finally Simeon could say, "These eyes of mine have seen your salvation,... a light for revelation to the nations, and glory for your people Israel." Luke 2:30,32

### Pray, and let God worry. - Martin Luther



A lmost 40 years ago, songwriter Mark Lowry scribbled down some lyrics for a Christmas song about Mary. After all, people were singing carols about the angels, the shepherds, and of course about the baby Jesus born on this holy and silent night. But few carols paid homage to the teenage girl who gave birth 2,000 years ago in the little town of Bethlehem, Judea.

The song that Lowry wrote reached Number 6 on CCM Magazine's Adult Contemporary Chart. At the time, Lowry was with the Gaither Vocal Band, and he himself recorded his song on their 1998 Christmas album, *Still the Greatest Story Ever Told*. Today, the song has become a modern Christmas classic, recorded by hundreds of artists over the years, and different versions have periodically reached the top 10 in the Billboard R&B and Holiday charts.

His song consists of questions.

Mary, did you know
That your baby boy will one day walk on water?
Mary, did you know
That your baby boy will save our sons and daughters?
Did you know
That your baby boy has come to make you new?
This child that you've delivered
Will soon deliver you?

Let's answer Lowry's questions.

No, Mary didn't know.

She was clueless. She was young. "How can this be?" she asks in verse 34 of our reading. Later, there were many things she would "ponder" in her heart. She didn't know what it would be like having to raise a boy who was always going about "his Father's business." She didn't know what it would be like to watch him suffer and die.

We don't know everything either, do we? We can't know what lies past this Christmas Eve Sunday. But Mary was a woman of faith: "Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word" (Luke 1:38).

This is a good verse for us to take with us into 2024.

### The Best Place to Have a God Encounter

That night there were shepherds staying in the fields nearby, guarding their flocks of sheep. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared among them, and the radiance of the Lord's glory surrounded them. They were terrified.— Luke 2:8-9



In the 1940s, the pastor of a tiny church in a rural town ordered a sign for their outdoor manger scene. The sign company was in another city and needed to know the dimensions and wording of the sign. So for clarity purposes, the pastor decided to send a telegraph of the text and measurements of the sign.

The next day, a Western Union employee was going about her normal routine when she was shocked to see this message come across the wire: "For unto us a child is born. 8 feet long, 3 feet wide."

What a surprise! But could you imagine the surprise of the shepherds in the fields so long ago on the night our Savior was born? Imagine, just going about your normal daily routine when, all of a sudden, a figure in bright light appears and begins to speak to you. Then thousands of those figures fill the sky and begin chanting. Could you imagine the shepherds going home to their wives and having to answer the question, "How was work?"

But the reality and truth of Christmas is that God meets us in the ordinary of life. As we go about our days, God is intricately working in our lives and meets us in the mundane. Our job is to simply be open to His leading in our lives. So even in the ordinary of life, look to encounter God in a big way.

Ask God to reveal Himself to you in the ordinary moments of everyday life.


### Questions for Thought

What might God say to you if you opened yourself up to hearing from Him every day?


