#### Greetings of Song,

This Sunday, we are having a Christmas song hymn sing. The familiar words and music often carry us through this season. Many of the Christmas hymns we sing have been with us for centuries—shaped by faith, longing, and hope in very different times and places. When we sing them, we join the voices of all those who have gone before us.

Some of our oldest Christmas hymns were written in times of uncertainty and struggle. "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" comes from prayers of a people who were waiting for rescue and justice. That longing still holds true today—part of why this hymn feels so necessary this Christmas season.

Other hymns grew out of times of great joy. "Joy to the World" wasn't originally written just for Christmas. It was a celebration of Christ's reign over all of creation. When we sing it now, we sing it not only celebrate the birth of Jesus, but also in the promise that God is still at work in our world.

Some hymns were written by ordinary pastors and congregation members. "Silent Night" was first sung in a small village church, with only a guitar (because the organ was broken). This song reminds us that holy moments don't have to be perfect—we just need to feel God's presence.

Then, there are hymns like "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" that are filled with theology set to music. This song teaches us as we sing in a way that words alone cannot.

When we sing these familiar songs, we don't just remember the Christmas story. We are living it! We are adding our voices to generations who sang together, trusting that light would come to even the darkest nights.




