flesh was discounted by the world in which they lived.

is that our bodies remain God's best way of getting to us.

"Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." ²⁰The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" ²¹But he was speaking of the temple of his body. **John 2:19**

Our takeaway from today's Gospel is to honor our bodies. Our flesh and bones, hair and joints, fingers, toes, and organs. Jesus rips through the temple, flipping over tables, scaring the animal sacrifices and daring all within ear shot to destroy it. Not the brick and mortar, but as John describes Jesus as the living temple, where God and humanity meet.

The temple that he claims will be 'rebuilt' in three days upon destruction. The same body that is sacrificed, rises again to ensure our eternal life. Jesus invites us to be a part of the good flesh, so that we might come to know God personally. God's

home is not a courtyard, narthex, or altar, rather the Divine lives in a different kind of temple; Jesus' own body.

It is hard for us to accept that our bodies are far from invincible, yet remain holy places, dwellings for God. It is just as hard to recognize that God loves all bodies, everywhere! When we learn to love our own bodies as divine temples it becomes much harder not to love and respect another's body as the same. Jesus interfered with temple life for the sake of justice and compassion. He would not stand for the violation of any sanctuary... anyone's body. As modern-day followers we too should raise our voices when others are exploited, abused, discriminated against or forced to live in poor or oppressive situations. We are God's hands and feet, the Creator's body on earth! How will we respond to Jesus' invitation to get comfortable in our skin and get to know God personally?

PRAYER: Dear God, remind me that my body is a temple. Encourage me in my living to respect and care for it, like the gift you meant it to be. Amen.


Grace Outreach Activities

Third Sunday in Lent, March 3, 2024

To forgive is to set a prisoner free, and discover that the prisoner is you!

Jess Walter's book, *The Cold Millions*, was one of 2020's most anticipated books. It told a fictionalized account of the labor and free speech struggles in the early 1900s in Spokane, Washington. The story features two brothers of different temperaments trying to make their dreams come true. Along the way, they meet a young firebrand, only in her early twenties, but who is already turning the world upside down. Elizabeth Gurley Flynn would go on to become a founding member of the ACLU.

In this book, Walters tells the following story.

A preacher, having given a sermon on grace in a small mining town, was approached at the church door by one of the miners. The man was looking distraught. He told the preacher he'd give anything if only he could believe that God really forgives sins.

- "I can't believe he'll forgive me if I just turn to him," the miner admitted. "It's too cheap."
- "You were working in the mine yesterday, weren't you?" the preacher asked.
- "Yes, of course," said the miner.
- "And how did you get out of the pit?"
- "The way I usually do; I got into the cage and was pulled to the top."
- "How much did you pay to come out of the pit?"
- "Why, nothing," the miner admitted.
- "You weren't afraid to trust yourself to the cage? Was it not too cheap?"
- "Oh, no," said the miner. "It was cheap for me, but it cost the company a lot of money to sink that shaft."

As soon as he said it, a change came over the miner's face. He saw the preacher's meaning. Forgiveness is free for us — but it was purchased at a terrible price, a price paid by Jesus on the cross.

How to preach the gospel through forgiveness

Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others.— Colossians 3:13

Evangelist John Wesley was returning home from service one evening when he was robbed. The thief didn't make out with much – a little money and some Christian literature. As he was running away, Wesley shouted, "You may regret this sort of life. And if you do, just remember the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin!".

Years later, Wesley was greeting people after a Sunday service when he was approached by a stranger. He was surprised to learn that this well-dressed businessman, now a believer in Christ, was the same man who had robbed him years before.



"I owe it all to you," the man told Wesley.

"Oh no, my friend," Wesley quipped back, "not to me, but to the precious blood of Christ that cleanses us from all sin!"

Grace and forgiveness have the power to destroy barriers of the gospel. That's because when we forgive, we literally give others a small taste of the grace of God. And when they've had a taste, they might just want more.

Don't forgive because it's easy. Forgive because it reflects the character of Christ. Live a life of forgiveness and you'll preach the gospel of grace to everyone you forgive!

Prayer Challenge

Pray and ask God to help you live a life of forgiveness - always showing grace to those who wrong you.
