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### Message to the Conference



**Greetings fellow members of Penn Central Conference,**

*From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view;*

(2 Corinthians 5:16a NRSV)

The lectionary passage for the fourth Sunday in Lent is written to the fractious church in Corinth where there was argumentation, tension, and mistrust. As Paul writes to soothe the distrust of the community toward himself, he also shares eloquent truths about God and Christ. Paul is aware of how easy it is for us in the church to get hung up on each other “from a human point of view” (literally “according to the flesh”). After all, this is how we encounter one another - as human beings, mortal and fleshly. Yet in this new life in Christ Paul urges us to see one another in a different way, in a new way, befitting our status as people in Christ. After all, if we are in Christ, there is a new creation and everything has become new!

Really? I don’t feel new. Not lately. I sense that my life, according to the flesh, is often weak, tired, in pain, and anxious. So what is Paul talking about when he says that all things become new? Is it possible that his reference to the new creation within us is the new spiritual self that lives flying toward God and Christ as its nesting place? Paul’s words tempt me to think it all happens at once, this new creation. But for me my new creation in Christ has been an ongoing process, not something I experienced all at once

at Confirmation, singing in youth choir, or graduating from seminary. It is now, here, still happening, still blooming. And Paul's reference to reconciliation is the key.

To live into being this new creation I must embrace – daily - that God in Christ has reconciled the world to himself (v.19) and does not count my trespasses against me. Instead, as a forgiven soul, I have been entrusted with the message of reconciliation as an ambassador of Christ. Not only to call others to reconciliation with God, but to allow my own reconciliation with God to influence my choices, my tone, my words, and my decisions every day. Which brings us back to the first line of the passage as quoted above: "From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view."

We are called to see one another as in Christ and therefore as ones who are also engaged in becoming a new creation. This is true even with other Christians with whom we disagree. This is extraordinarily difficult. We do enjoy, after all, judging for ourselves who is in Christ and who is not, even if we are all calling ourselves Christian. How did we slip so easily into regarding one another from a human point of view? WE are called to something higher, something more difficult.

Seeing one another as in Christ means trusting that Christ is at work in their lives in ways we will never know. That takes practice and diligence. And in these days, what better time to consider our own reconciliation with God and how it might help us see one another differently?



