Matthew 2:10-11

What growing older really means for you

That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day.— 2 Corinthians 4:16

A new member of the bridge club showed up one afternoon wearing a beautiful gold locket. Another player approached her and said, "That's such a lovely piece. Do you keep a memento in it"?



"Yes," the woman answered. "It's a piece of my husband's hair I keep to help me remember."

"Oh, I'm so sorry," the player replied. "How long ago did he pass away?"

The newcomer quipped, "Pass away? Oh, he's still alive. It's his hair that's gone!"

Someone once said, "Do not regret growing older. It is a privilege denied to many." And with so much focus today on doing whatever it takes to stay young, many people completely miss out on a biblical understanding of what it means to age. They miss the fact that their gray hairs, baldness, wrinkles, and aches all have a purpose in the plan of God.

So what is the right biblical understanding of aging? Well, as we see in today's passage, aging is a lifelong tradeoff of the physical for the spiritual. Young people may have more physical vitality, but are usually less mature spiritually. As we get older, however, we may lose our physical strength, but we grow spiritually and become more equipped to invest in others' lives.

Be willing to make that tradeoff. Don't despise growing older. **Instead, embrace your aging as a sign that while you may lose physical vigor, you're growing each day in your spiritual strength!**

Prayer Challenge

Pray and ask God to give you a right understanding of aging as a lifelong tradeoff for something much better than physical strength.

Questions for thought

What is the one thing that gives you the most anxiety about aging?

How might this proper understanding of growing older as a tradeoff change your attitude toward aging, as well as impact your relationship with God and others?

Scripture Reading: Genesis 1:1-5

Don't make plans; make options. —Jennifer Aniston



The headline screamed an amazing and unheard of development: "105-Year-Old Sprinter Hidekichi Miyazaki Sets New Record!"

This was not fake news. On September 23, 2015, Miyazaki did, indeed, compete and win, and thereby became the Guinness World Records oldest competitive sprinter. Miyazaki ran the 100-meter dash and did it in 42.22 seconds.

There are three things impressive about Miyazaki. First, *he was not satisfied*. Published reports said he was not impressed by his performance. He complained of not being in good condition. He expressly said that he was not satisfied with his time.

Second, he had a goal. His target for this particular race was 35 seconds.

Third, his philosophy was that it is never too late to start a new thing! Miyazaki did not begin to participate in track and field sports until he was in his 90s!

What goals and records have you set your sights on for 2024?

The story of this Japanese centenarian has some valuable lessons for us.

First, it is easy for all of us, regardless of our age, to be satisfied with the status quo. We might be just fine with our level of physical fitness, or our spiritual growth. Perhaps we are okay with the state of our family relationships. They might not get better, but at least they won't get worse. "It is what it is," we say.

Is this the attitude we want to have going into 2024?

Second, Miyazaki had a goal. Even though he was 105, he understood the importance of striving toward an objective. The apostle Paul acknowledged the importance of goal-setting in his letter to the Philippians: "Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own ... This one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus" (3:12-14).

Third, Miyazaki believed it was never too late to start over. This, indeed, is the essence of the gospel. Today is the day of salvation, renewal and change!

After his amazing record-setting event, Miyazaki lived for another three years, dying on January 23, 2019, at the age of 108. But while he was alive, he lived ... as though there was no tomorrow.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank you for the gift of another year, for allowing me to see the dawn of new opportunities. May I be strong and courageous and accept whatever challenges face me in 2024. In your name I pray. Amen.
