I once heard young poet laureate, Amanda Gorman, declare, "If we merge mercy with might and might with right, then love becomes our legacy."

Walking along the shoreline he began to build his legacy of love. He chose disciples from the packed, damp sand by the water's edge the way many of us stop to collect shells, bits of driftwood, and colorful sea glass. He called to them on an ordinary day, over the sound of gulls and their rough-hewn nets, he invited them to join his mission. Peter and Andrew, James and John. They left their nets, boats, fish, and families and followed him. Talk about faith in action. Peter, Andrew, James and John could not have foreseen how dropping their nets and blindly following would lead them to set a new course for their lives. How might we be awakened to hear and hopefully share the Good News?

Fun fact of the day: Grace Kelly, Bob Newhart, Dick Clark, Audrey Hepburn, Martin Luther King, Jr, Barbara Walters and Anne Frank were all born in 1929. Sit with that for a moment. What diverse lives lived within this same timeline! Most went on to become famous entertainers, but two are more globally celebrated as people who made a difference by their courage.

We can get so inwardly focused on what is happening right here and now that we miss the global picture. Jonah, asked to be thrown into the water. James, John, Andrew, and Peter, left their boats and their work behind. In the same lifetime that Dr. King's ministry became activism, Gandhi was having non-violent protests in India, fighting for his county's independence. Mother Teresa was traveling the east helping the poor and desolate, while Anne Frank was fighting to survive hidden away in a secret room. Twenty-two-year-old Amanda Gorman, is a modern day voice for truth. How can we make sure **our voice** makes a difference...because every voice is needed!

What to do when you feel forgotten

What are mere mortals that you should think about them, human beings that you should care for them?—Psalm 8:4

A man from the city was visiting relatives out on a farm. He watched as his uncle whistled at his dog and his dog herded cattle into the corral. Then, the dog latched the gate with her paw. The man was astounded and said, "Wow! That's some dog. What's her name?"

The old farmer thought for a minute before he asked, "What do you call that red flower that smells good and has thorns on the stem?"

"A rose?"



"That's it!" the farmer exclaimed as he turned to his wife. "Rose, what's the name of this dog?"

People can often forget some very important details of life. But there's one who never forgets anything: God. In fact, He's so mindful of us that He rescued us from the darkness of sin even though our sin separated us from Him.

Don't be discouraged when you feel forgotten by others. Instead, think of the one who always remembers you and loves you so much that He rescued you from the very sin that separated you from Him. Remember God!

Prayer Challenge

Pray that God would encourage you when others forget you and thank Him that He loves you and is mindful of you enough to save you from you sins.

Questions for thought

Think of a time when someone you cared about forgot something important. How did it make you feel?

What does God's act of sending Jesus to rescue you say about how He loves you?



Scripture Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1-10, (11-20)

Listening to God is far more important than giving him your ideas.

The little boy Samuel had been living in the temple ever since his mother Hannah had delivered him into the watchful care of the priest, Eli. There must have been days when the young Samuel wondered what his mother had gotten him into. He was in training to become a full-time servant of God, but not once had he perceived God's presence in the temple or God's purpose for his life. Samuel had been dedicated to God, but where was God?

Good mentor that he was, Eli gives Samuel three definite things to do so that he may be ready for a visit from God: "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening" (v. 9). Look at this advice carefully.

LIE DOWN: Samuel is much like the rest of us. He is so busy running around that he hardly knows where he is going. Eli's advice to "lie down" is a way of saying, "Let go and let God. Relax. Surrender to a force bigger than you."

LISTEN UP: The second part of Eli's advice to Samuel is implied when he begins to describe what Samuel should do "if he calls you." In order to hear that call, Samuel must be listening. In order for all of us to have a vision of God or to experience God's presence, we must use our ears.

TALK BACK: God waits for us to respond, to question, even challenge the divine word that comes to us. Because God wants a relationship with us, we must be able to understand God's will and perceive God's wisdom. We must talk back to God. Sometimes, this dialogue is nothing more than our consent — as Samuel utters when the word of the Lord finally comes to him. Sometimes it is a far more interactive, problematic conversation — as it was with Job, Moses, Jonah or Jeremiah.

God offers us a new way of seeing, of envisioning the world. The greatest vision God sent us is Jesus Christ. In Christ's resurrection we are assured God's presence is frequent, that it is continually with us in this world.

In relationship with Christ, we can be assured that Eli's advice still holds. For in Christ, we can trust God enough to lie down, listen up and talk back.






