Deacon's Fund Offering

The Deacon's Fund at Grace was proposed by Rev. Carl Folk during the December 1981 Consistory meeting. The Consistory approved the fund at that meeting and the congregation approved it at the January 1982 Annual Congregation Meeting.

This fund was established to help members of Grace who may be temporarily in financial need due to illness, layoff, accident, etc.

This is the way it works: If a member is in need, he/she contacts the pastor who refers the need to the Deacon Fund Committee.

There are no names mentioned. The pastor contacts the committee members and explains the need. The members then decide if assistance should be given. The aid is temporary and not ongoing. No funds are given directly to individual(s). For example, if a member is short on funds and cannot pay his/her electric bill, Grace pays it through the Deacon's fund.

For many years there were Deacon Fund offering envelopes in our box of donation envelopes. These were removed a few years ago and the collections stopped. We are going to try collecting again 2 times per year – Fall and Spring. We will have blue and white envelopes labeled Deacon's Fund by the entrances near the offering plates during the month of November for anyone who may wish to donate. Thank you for your consideration.

October 2023 Consistory Digest

There were 8 members present. Also in attendance: Janette Becker, Amy Fawks, Patti Miller, Judy Rummel.

Treasurer's report: September 2023

General pledge September 2023: \$8,536.00 General pledge September 2022: \$6,105.00

Carroll Miller reported Grace had a surplus in Operating Funds of \$4,776.54 in September. Without a salary for a pastor and secretary we saved \$6,900.00. Other expenses were slightly below Budget. We did pay \$4,394.93 for several repairs; however, they were covered by the Zeigler Funds. Although Operating Funds look OK for September, our investments did not do well for the 3rd Quarter. Asset values decreased \$128,209.69. Our total unrestricted investment funds are still \$505,304.19.

After some discussion it was decided to sign an agreement with Axiom, a temp agency, to help Grace find an office secretary/bookkeeper. Axiom's structure fee shows, "40% mark up above pay rate."

Trustees:

Water is coming in through the ceiling and walls at the northwest corner of the education wing. It was suggested to call Heidler Roofing to check for drain clogs on the roof and repair down spouting that is loose.

Amy Fawks reported the following:

Worship and Music met in September and planned events/special worship through November. Eileen McKinley offered to take notes during the meetings.

- O Lyrics for contemporary songs. There was a request that we create a "song book" of contemporary songs that we sing during worship. Each week, there is a printed 1/2 sheet of the lyrics that also appear on the screen. A repository is being created of all of the contemporary songs we sing each week. The ultimate goal will be to create a "song book" for people to use if they choose to each week.
- Oct 15th Harvest Home collections through Oct. 15th. We will have a small recognition of Harvest Home during the Oct. 15th worship.
- Nov 5th: All Saints Sunday: We will use the pillared candelabras to light candles in memory of
 those who have passed at Grace (we discussed since Covid). Families of those we lost will be invited
 to worship. We will also have tea lights available to light in memory of anyone who has passed. A
 bell will be rung with each person's name read.
- Nov 12th We will be having a Veteran's Day service with some featured music by Parker and Deb Rickrode.
- o Nov 19th: worship featuring a Thanksgiving Service
- Because we are using a variety of creeds each week, a mention of this was shared in the Days of Grace.

- o In the spirit of transparency and openness, the members of the newly formed Worship and Music committee were published in the Days of Grace
- o Next meeting is Nov 15th.

Deacon's Fund offering envelopes will be available in November for anyone who would like to donate.

After some discussion it was decided Patti Miller could hold a service for Transgender Day of Remembrance in the parking lot or in Fellowship Hall if it is raining. The service will be November 20.

Highlights form Patti Miller's Visitation Report:

- During September I made 20 visits to senior care facilities and homes, fewer than usual since I had COVID and isolated for 10 days so as not to endanger any of our members. A few of our members prefer a phone call to a visit, so I make sure to spend time in conversation with them. I made over 30 phone calls to stay in touch with shut-ins and to arrange visits.
- I did use the time to create a fall pamphlet for those on the mailing list, entitled Autumn's Promises which included seven Bible verses, pictures, and words of encouragement as well as relevant phone numbers.

 I continue to use a spreadsheet format to keep track of visits, communion, calls, and other forms of communication so that no one is forgotten, and I continue to send birthday, anniversary, and thinking-of-you cards.
- I record the prayer list and the Bible moment every evening around 10 PM on our special phone line, and often receive messages from those who listen, both on the line and through calls on my phone and cards.

I have often been told "Be careful what you ask for". Last month, I commented on looking forward to those crisp fall days while we were enjoying what seemed like extended summer weather. This morning, there was frost. So it seems that the fall weather has arrived at last......and I am stuck lamenting those warm summer days again. As the temperatures are cooling off outside though, the activity and fellowship at Grace seems to be warming up.

Grace started off the month of October with the celebration of Worldwide Communion Day, led by Rev. Joel Hummel. Our very own Amy Fawks and Patti Miller once again led Sunday worship services, with such meaningful sermons: "Boundless Love and Invitation to All", "Put God First", and "Love Cubed". Last month I mentioned that Grace has also enjoyed volunteers from the congregation to be lectors. This month, we were blessed again with guest lectors Merle Whisler, Gary Rickrode, Len Bankert, and Craig Bixler. Many of our beloved traditions have been brought back to our Sunday services, such as various Creed recitals and the Choral Benediction. A suggestion was made to somehow bring back the offering Doxology and I am happy to say that the worship and music committee made it happen. October also marked the official start for our new organist/pianist/trumpet player.....the list goes on, Christian Keller. With our favorite hymns being played, new songs we are introduced to, members returning, offerings and tithes growing, the joyous noise from the gathering place before Sunday service, and our various committees hard at work, I keep hearing members of the congregation say that "It feels like church again". I couldn't agree more and we hope to keep up the good work.

Grace's various committees are working more diligently than ever. The Outreach Committee hosted a car show on a rainy Saturday. The weather may not have cooperated, but the donations of socks and money was wonderful. The Personnel Committee finalized a job description for our open secretary position and has begun interviews with candidates. Worship and Music is looking to our holiday season and working hard to keep up this momentum of excellent Sunday services. Lets not forget our small groups that continue to meet. The Tuesday afternoon group meets

in the Gathering Place for a time of fellowship, snacks, and fun games. Our Wednesday bible study group has been mixing it up with watching some meaningful movie clips in Fellowship Hall. The monthly Friday movie group watched "Dave" this month and will be watching "Invincible" in November.

Consistory has met multiple times this month as we also try to continue our good works. Our primary focus has been the discussion of the proposal we received last month. In September, Grace's consistory met with another local UCC church's leadership, to see if "yoking" or sharing a pastor would work. Both teams came up with some possibilities of this arrangement, with considerations on worship times, weekly responsibilities, travel, financial concerns, and strategies if either congregation felt this solution was causing more problems instead of solving them. Both consistory presidents met, along with representation from Penn Central Conference, to develop a memorandum of understanding. This document listed out all of the concerns that would affect both church families and was to be shared and discussed amongst both consistories at their monthly meetings. As I am writing this newsletter, Grace's consistory has some new ideas and will be meeting with members of Penn Central Conference's leadership in early November. Our plan is to have the support and understanding of how we are doing now, before we bring this proposal before both congregations. While it seems our plates are already full, Consistory is also working on our year end budgeting process and annual meeting agenda. I don't think I will ever be able to express the gratitude I have for such a hard working team.

In wrapping up this monthly update, I would like to thank all who are working to make Grace church better than ever. As always, if you have a thought or suggestion, please let consistory know. The cooler weather can continue as much as it wants. The warm hearts and souls here are Grace are more than enough to keep that feeling of summer going.

More donors needed to rebuild blood supply

Since announcing a national blood and platelet shortage a month ago, thousands of donors across the country have rolled up a sleeve to help

rebuild the American Red Cross blood and platelet supply. As that generosity continues, we're working around-the-clock to ensure patients have access to lifesaving transfusions and must collect 10,000 additional blood and platelet donations – over and above expectations – each week over the next month to sufficiently meet hospital needs.

Donors of all blood types are urged to book a time to give now, especially those with type O blood or those giving platelets.


