Meet Amy Fawks our Associate Pastor!



Sunday begins early as she is the first one to arrive in church. Amy unlocks, turns on lights, makes coffee and tea, puts out the Welcome flag, moves about the church doing other tasks, then greets us upon arrival as we gather to worship together. That's what **WE SEE**.

Throughout the week Amy PREPARES. She seeks God's wisdom to prepare a meaningful WOR-SHIP service for Grace two to three Sundays each month. Searching scriptures from many bible versions and following the revised common lectionary. Amy composes sermons that she prays

will touch our hearts and strengthen our faith. She writes the call to worship and opening prayer. In addition she may select a meaningful video to enhance the message. Amy remains mindful to honor traditions and be open to new elements as we seek together to give thanks and praise God. She also creates bulletins from cover to announcements. She selects modern music and creates their inserts. She must verify and report the use of all copyrighted songs to the licensing board. Amy displays the updated lectionary(scriptures), lector signup sheet and service handout for lectors. She oversees the soundboard operator and prepares their handout with each worship.

A church is a gathering of God's followers who CONNECT to praise Him, seek His word, serve others and share the Good News. Amy meets with Pastor Fred at least twice a month and communicates frequently via email and text. She presently calls some on our visitation list and reaches out in person as Pastor Fred may request. She responds to the questions and needs of all church staff and attends monthly Staff, Worship and Music, and Consistory meetings. Amy is available to all church members for prayer requests and for any need or concern they may share.

TECHNOLOGY has come to stay...and with it tasks to make it happen! Called the "deck", the collection of changing slides we see on the screen throughout each service, must be adapted weekly. Updates are made to the announcements, Call to Worship, Prayer, Creed, hymn lyrics, scripture readings, videos, special music...all proofed for enhanced background, readability and fit on our screens. Amy also is responsible for updating the church website which includes the weekly mailer, Days of Grace, calendar, the lectionary, and any alerts that may need communicated. Grace also has a Facebook page on which Amy posts events happening, and a Livestream of our Sunday worship. She shares welcoming posts, responds to posts and monitors for unwelcome scam activity. Grace relies on Amy's training and knowledge for all our audio and visual needs right down to the setting up of microphones, sound checks and charging equipment.

Apart from Amy's church responsibilities, she is a sixth-grade teacher in Spring Grove School District, married to Dave and mother to Lexi, Nathan and Ellie along with several furry four-legged critters. With the caring and financial support of our church, Amy has been approved as a Member in Discernment with the Gettysburg Association of the UCC Penn Central Conference. She is presently taking classes through the Pennsylvania Academy of Ministry sponsored by Lancaster Seminary.

We are thankful that Amy has agreed to be our Associate Pastor as we partner with Gettysburg Trinity UCC and Pastor Fred Young.

There were two recent congregation meetings. The first meeting was held Sunday September 29 to ask the congregation for \$26,000 to remove the asbestos floor tiles in Fellowship Hall and replace with new floor tiles. The vote was 26 in favor and 2 opposed. The second meeting was held Sunday November 10 to change Amy Fawks' title to associate pastor at Grace. The vote was 35 in favor and 4 opposed.



November 2024 Consistory Meeting Digest

There were 12 members present including Pastor Young, Associate Pastor Fawks, and Rick Boyer.

Treasurer's Report:

Four members of the Trinity UCC Gettysburg Consistory attended the meeting to review the Memorandum of Understanding for shared Transitional Ministry between Trinity UCC and Grace. The Trinity members stated there are no complaints, and overall, things are going well. Grace Consistory members stated things are going well at Grace. Rev. Young had a concern about missing a service at Trinity. It was suggested the two congregations should try some activities together. A Trinity member asked, "What about long term?" It was decided to continue the MOU for another 6 months, look at how the congregations can work closer together, and possibly look beyond at the next review.

The Personnel Committee presented a proposed Grace UCC Confidential Employee Performance Evaluation. The Consistory approved the evaluation. It will be used in future annual employee reviews.

Glen Ruhlman, a member of the By-laws/Policy Committee, distributed the Fundraising Policy for review. Comments and any suggested changes will be made at the December meeting.

Dave Fawks reported:

- The floor tiles have been replaced in Fellowship Hall with the exception of the tiles under the tech desk. Bill Trump will be returning to replace floor trim. Mr. Trump will be asked about replacing the tiles under the desk. The floor can be waxed in 2 to 3 weeks.
- The ceiling tiles in the hall will soon be replaced.
- New lower wattage light bulbs are being installed in the hall.

The Worship & Music Committee has determined the old figurines used in the outdoor nativity scene are too damaged to use and too expensive to replace. Metal pieces at an approximate cost of \$600 are being considered for purchase. The creche is still useable.

Pastor Young's November 2024 Advisements:

The next Town Hall is scheduled for Sunday, November 24th at 10AM. The format will be different for this discussion. Worship will be held in Fellowship Hall and will begin with Breaking of the Bread and will end with us sharing the Cup of Blessing. Worship elements, music, scriptures, prayers and our conversation will all take place in and around the Communion Elements. All will be invited to bring along their favorite aspects of worship and why. We will also talk about hopes and dreams for our time of worship.
