<u>Street Parking</u> – Once again, we must remind residents that vehicles may not be parked in street in any way, shape, or form for a prolonged period of time. They must never be parked in a way that impedes another resident from entering or exiting their driveway safely, and must never be parked in a way that makes the road impassable. Street parking creates a danger for neighborhood walkers, bike riders, etc. (especially children). The city has fielded multiple complaints regarding street parking over the past few months. We will again be addressing this issue at our next Commissioner Meeting, but encourage residents to call the sheriff's office if a vehicle is parked in the street in a way that hinders their ability to enter or exit their driveway.
