# We are pleased to announce the Grand Opening of the Greene County Historical Society Museum and the Linwood A. Rhodes Gallery at 360 Main Street in Stanardsville.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, October 4, 2015. The opening ceremonies will start promptly at 3 PM and will be followed by a reception. The museum and gallery will remain open until 5 PM to welcome members and friends to our new location.

Parking at 360 Main Street for October 4<sup>th</sup> will be limited to handicapped individuals and others with special needs. We hope to see a crowd! So please park at the Greene County Library, PVCC or in the parking areas at Mayor Loweøs property at 308 Main Street (west of Noon Whistle Pottery). There will be parking attendants.

Subsequently, our open hours will continue as previously ó Fridays and Saturdays from 10 AM to 3 PM, and by appointment. The generosity of Linwood Rhodes and Ethyle Cole Giuseppe have made it possible for us to exhibit a myriad of items donated by Greene families during the 36+ years since our founding that have remained in storage for lack of space. We look forward to seeing familiar faces and making many new friends in the weeks and months to come as they enjoy different facets of the history of Greene County.

Well, it has been a very busy few months!! From the outside, the most visible progress is the completion of a wonderful new gallery to house Linwood Rhodes@ wildlife art collection and provide a welcome meeting space.

Since I last wrote volunteers have performed a huge number of tasks, including: with the help of Blue Ridge Movers, moved the collections from the jail to 360 Main Street and organized storage there; greeted visitors at the jail during events in Court Square 6 the jail will always be our biggest and best artifact, and we plan to develop new exhibits there to explain its past; found appropriate display furniture and modified it to suit our needs; begun to develop new exhibits to take advantage of the great spaces in the house; begun organizing the books in our library, and the architecture and family history files; moved the material we had in offsite storage to 360 Main Street; with much gratitude to Linwood® widow, Mrs. Barbara Rhodes, collected the remaining items of his collection from Arlington; set up research and other material for sale in our gift shop; organized and conducted the ongoing buy-a-brick walkway campaign; and carried out countless other activities. And of course, as everyone knows, acquiring a house and grounds requires attention to a million and one other details. Many hundreds of hours of volunteer time have gone into thinking about, and acting on, ways to make 360 Main Street the best it could possibly be.

Our expectation that we would be able to open in the spring was hopelessly optimistic, but we are delighted to have now scheduled our Grand Opening for October 4<sup>th</sup>! Our Opening Ceremony will start at 3 PM, with appropriate dignitaries in attendance, and we hope that many of you will stay to peruse new displays, have some refreshments and celebrate this historic moment together.

After the opening, we will continue to welcome visitors on Fridays and Saturdays from 10 AM until 3PM, as well as being delighted to make appointments for other times. And there will be many more activities planned for the future. A continuous walkway to the front of the house from paved parking close to the gallery allows handicapped access to both buildings. There is additional gravel parking to the south of the gallery. Our new home ó 360 Main Street ó is on Business Route 33 at the east end of Stanardsville, a much more visible location than in the past.

Now more than ever members need to know how much we welcome their help as volunteers in a myriad of ways. Thanks to the internet and email, you dongt have to be present at 360 Main Street to help with many tasks, although the house and gallery are such pleasant places to be that I for one find it hard to stay away. Your name or memorial can become a permanent part of the walkway to the entrance of the Greene County Historical Society Museum at 360 Main Street in Stanardsville. An engraved brick is the perfect way to honor a loved one, commemorate a special occasion, or make sure your family name is included. There are two sizes of bricks. Four inch by eight inch bricks can have up to 3 lines of engraving with 15 characters per line. Eight inch by eight inch bricks have 6 lines of engraving. Please circle size required. Please print the text you wish to appear on your brick on the grid below, using only 3 lines for the smaller brick. Allow one box for every character, space or punctuation mark. Please use all CAPITAL letters.
