SMITH AND WETSEL CEMETERIES

When the new world was settled, there weren't, obviously, any cemeteries, and in the beginning, no churches. When a death occurred among the pioneers, they had to bury their dead on their farms and homesteads. Later, even after churches became prevalent, roads were inadequate and it was easier to inter the dead at home rather than make the long, often arduous, trip to public burying grounds.

As a result, the practice of keeping family cemeteries was established early, and only in this century has it become customary to use public facilities. Consequently, family farms are dotted with cemeteries. Almost every old established farm has one—some more than one, since it was the custom to bury servants in plots to themselves.

Small cemeteries are scattered around Greene County, on farms, beside roads, and in other out-of-the-way places. Some of these are so old that no one living remembers who were buried there. Resting among these unknown and sometimes unidentified graves may be the missing link in someone's genealogy search. This is the reason that the Greene County Historical Society feels that it is important to research and publish accounts of these cemeteries wherever we find them, even with some of the graves unidentified.

The two following accounts of cemeteries have been carefully researched.
