Friendly reminder, we are all part of an HOA whose primary goal is to ensure that our neighborhood remains attractive, safe, and that property values are maintained. With that in mind please help with the following. We thank you in advance for complying as it is a cost to the HOA to send violation letters and follow up on these issues

Cars continue to be habitually parked on the street. Our covenants on page 6 state “No trailer, truck, motorcycle, commercial vehicle, camper trailer, camping vehicle or boat shall be parked or kept on any lot any time unless housed in a garage or basement for a period in excess of 48 hours. No inoperable or junk autos shall be habitually or repeatedly parked or kept on any lot or on any street. No trailer, boat, truck or other vehicle, except automobiles shall be parked on any street in the subdivision for a period in excess of 24 hours.

Trash and debris. Please do not litter. Discarded cigarette packs have been an issue lately on Periwinkle. Also, reminder: other than trash day, your containers must be stored out of sight from passing cars. Debris and trash should be out of curb view. As we do spring cleaning, please remember HOA rules and Floyd County ordinance strictly forbid any open fire other than grills and small fire pits (burn logs only).

Yard Maintenance - Lawns are to be kept “neat and attractive in appearance (Covenants pg 7). This includes mowing and edging grass. This includes keeping your yard free of all weeds and trash. Bushes should be neat and trimmed in the front and back of the residence. Contact us if needing referrals for someone to mow on a one-time basis.

Mailboxes - These must be maintained. Please call Eagle Sign and Design (502-561-0007) to order a new one. If you only need a black mailbox (not the bracket, too), look at Home Depot or Lowes; however, they must match the neighborhood’s style. (No emblems or art.) Black Rustoleum semi-gloss spray paint may work for your undamaged posts. Some residences have low perennial ground flowers, but please, no large, woody climbing ornamental plants such as vines, Clematis, or roses. (Covenants pg 4). Email us for questions.

Basketball nets - They can’t be kept on or near the street.

Fence and Shed Installation - Plan to build this spring? Please contact the HOA (koehlerplacehoa@gmail.com) to inquire about specs and for advance review/approval to avoid conflict or the need to remove it later.

Animals - Personal home pets only and they must be kept in your yard! Dogs should be walked with a leash, and don’t forget your poop bags! No excessive barking and definitely none at night per Floyd County ordinance. Be mindful that neighbors work various shifts and have young children.

Signs - Only one yard sign is permitted for advertising the sale or rent of your home. Please inform your realtors. If you have an open house, ask them to remove it at the end of that day. Absolutely no sale signs are permitted at KP entrance, along our KP streets or at stop signs. (Covenants pg 6)

General Information for Residents:

Koehler Place is New Albany Township.

This does not include the City of New Albany, so we can’t vote in the city’s elections.

We are Floyd County residents governed by FC Commissioners and FC County Council Members.

Our law enforcement agency is Floyd County Sheriff’s department (not New Albany Police).
