**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act providing a standing appropriation to the state board of  
2 regents for pediatric cancer research at the university of  
3 Iowa hospitals and clinics.  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 135.196 Pediatric cancer research  
2 — appropriation.

3 For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and for each  
4 fiscal year thereafter, there is appropriated from the general  
5 fund of the state to the state board of regents an amount  
6 equal to one dollar per resident of the state on July 1 of the  
7 same fiscal year, based on the most recent annual population  
8 estimate issued by the United States census bureau, not to  
9 exceed three million dollars per fiscal year, to be used  
10 for pediatric cancer research including but not limited to  
11 laboratory research and clinical trials at the university of  
12 Iowa hospitals and clinics. Moneys appropriated under this  
13 section shall not be used for administrative or overhead  
14 costs, or activities not directly related to pediatric cancer  
15 research. The state board of regents shall submit an annual  
16 report to the governor and the general assembly by October  
17 1 detailing how the appropriated moneys were used in the  
18 immediately preceding fiscal year.

19 EXPLANATION

20 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
21 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

22 This bill provides a standing appropriation from the general  
23 fund of the state to the state board of regents (regents) for  
24 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and each fiscal year  
25 thereafter in an amount equal to \$1 per Iowa resident, based  
26 on the most recent annual population estimate by the United  
27 States census bureau, not to exceed \$3 million per fiscal year.  
28 The bill provides that the moneys are to be used for pediatric  
29 cancer research, including laboratory research and clinical  
30 trials at the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics. The  
31 moneys are not to be used for administrative or overhead costs  
32 and unrelated activities.

33 The bill requires the regents to submit an annual report to  
34 the governor and the general assembly detailing how the moneys  
35 were used in the immediately preceding fiscal year.
